### **FLORIDA BRIGHT FUTURES**

Florida Bright Futures is a state funded program that provides students with the opportunity to earn 100% tuition or 75% tuition based on weighted GPA and SAT/ACT scores. In order to be eligible for the 100% scholarship, students need to perform 100 hours of community service and log it through Profferfish. To be eligible for the 75% scholarship, students must complete 75 community service hours and log these hours into Profferfish.

In addition to students meeting these requirements, students who earn the AICE Diploma are also eligible to receive Florida Bright Futures with completion of 100 service hours. The program is accepted at any Public Florida University. The credit cost can also be translated to the cost of a Private University within the state of Florida, the student would then be responsible for the difference in credit hour cost.

#### **Scholarship America Dream Award**

Award: \$5,000- \$10,000 **Deadline: October 15, 2021** 

- Be at least 17 years of age.
- Be U.S. citizens, U.S. permanent residents (holders of a Permanent Resident Card), or individuals granted deferred action status under the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals Program (DACA).
- Have received a high school diploma or the equivalent from a U.S. school by September 2021.
- Have completed or expect to successfully complete a minimum of one full year of postsecondary education by June 2022.
- Plan to enroll in full-time undergraduate study at the sophomore year level or higher at an accredited two- or four-year college, university or vocational-technical school in the United States for the entire 2022-2023 academic year.
- Be studying to obtain an Associate's or first Bachelor's degree.
- Have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale (or its equivalent).
- Demonstrate financial need.

#### **Voice of Democracy**

The National Association of Broadcasters (NAB) started the Voice of Democracy Scholarship Competition in 1947. The VFW became a national sponsor in the late 1950s and assumed sole responsibility for the program in 1961. Many notables have participated in Voice of Democracy including journalist Charles Kuralt, Miss America Anita Bryant and U.S. Attorney General John Ashcroft. The Voice of Democracy competition provides high school freshmen, sophomores, juniors and seniors the opportunity to write and record an essay on a patriotic theme, competing for more than \$2 million in college scholarships and incentives. State winners compete for \$154,000 in scholarships - with the first place national winner receiving a \$30,000 scholarship.
