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

The comprehensive curriculum allows students to build upon a foundation of Design Concepts and Drawing I in their freshman year and continues with studio, art history, and portfolio development classes with their experience culminating with an intensive Senior Project.











Students will begin to develop a visual literacy with the ability to engage in formal criticism. Graphic Design courses emphasize an intellectual understanding toward visual communication while establishing skills in graphics, typography, and layout.

Coursework is augmented with field trips to galleries, museums, and workshops with visiting artists. Students are also encouraged to participate in numerous local, regional and national competitions and exhibitions.
