- 3 years ago we adjusted our approach to counseling when an entire new counseling team was brought in
- Constant re-examination of past practices
- Creation of new systems and protocols focused on a student centered approach and skills building
- Expanding services to include wider variety of tier 1 supports for broader impact for more students
- Creation of data gathering tools and utilizing collected data to inform decision making throughout the school

- Persistent question: How can we best serve OUR students?
 - Needs Assessment
 - Tier 1 supports:
 - Small groups
 - Data-driven practices and interventions
 - Relationship first

 - Equitable access to counseling services
 - 6 – 8 week support cycle

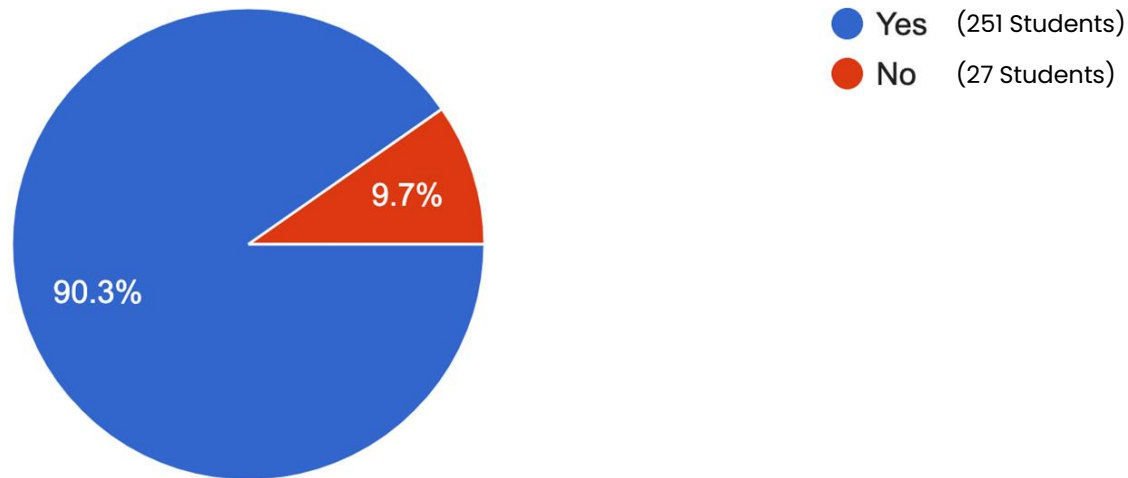

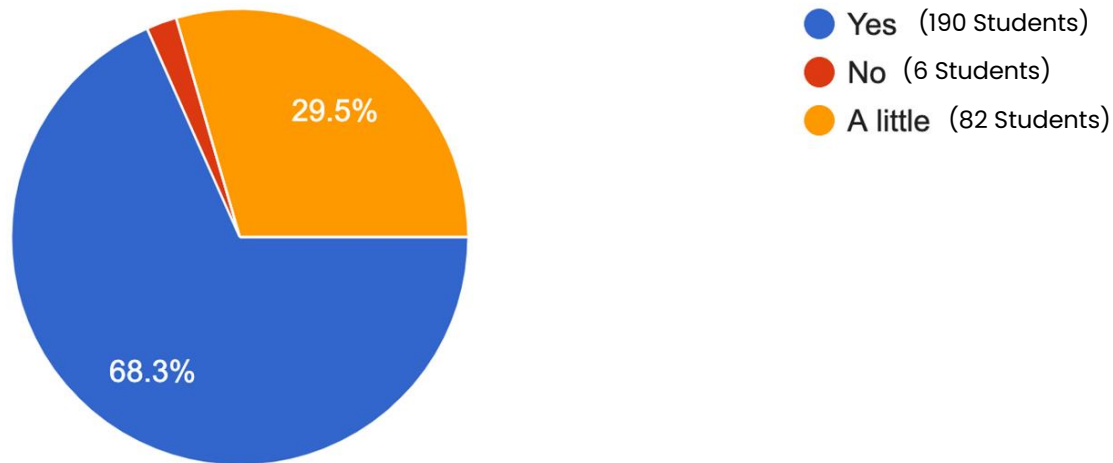

- IB Diplomas Earned 2021
