Parent Engagement Results & Efforts to Improve-#2

70.7% of parents feel the amount of homework given is appropriate

According to last year's Parent School Perception Survey data, only 70% of you feel that the amount of homework given is appropriate. As a result, I reached out to the K-5 classroom teachers to ask them to share their homework expectations.

Many teachers shared that the amount of actual time expected to be spent on homework is minimal. They shared; however, that they may ask kids to read at home daily and/or each have a few other expectations outlined below. It's important to note that if a child is spending a lot of time at night doing what they call "homework", it MAY actually be the result of poor use of in class work time resulting in work then needing to be brought home.

Following most lessons, teachers provide time in class to practice what was learned. While many students do take advantage of this time and use it wisely, others do not. As a result, they must then bring it home to complete. They may be calling this work- "homework".

If this happens on a regular basis, we do understand that it could look like a lot of work is being assigned. Please ask your child the next time you witness this happening: *Are you taking advantage of the time your teacher is providing in class to get your work completed?* If the answer is no, a change in behavior might be necessary.

Here's what teachers reported regarding homework:

Kdn.- No homework is assigned; however, reading with your child daily is recommended.

Gr.1- 5-10 min./daily (Read fluency passages 3x each and work on the weekly Superkids worksheets and weekly math worksheets.) Some kids may elect to work on the sheets for a couple of min. each day OR they may choose to complete them all in one sitting which would take about 10 min. for both.

Gr.2- 15-20 min/daily- Spelling practice & nightly reading

Gr.3- 20 min./daily ~ Reading and Soon Math Fact Practice. Students are given time in class to complete math work, but at times, may have a problem or two to finish at home.

Gr.4- 20-30 min./daily-Read nightly and complete iReady math work if their goal of working 60 min./week has not been met.

Gr.5- 30-60 min./daily (This would be true if time was not spent wisely during work time in class.)

Family Fun Festival

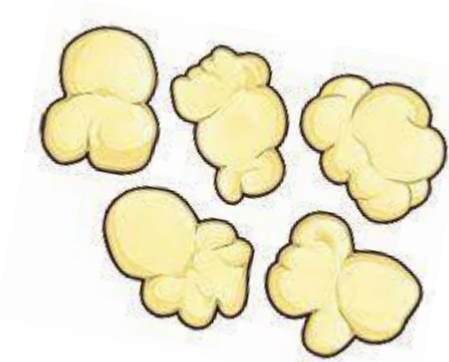

COVID Information

WSD COVID GUIDELINES 21-22

Students must stay home from school if they have the following symptoms.

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- If a student has symptoms, it is recommended that they immediately be tested for COVID, regardless of vaccine status.
- The student may return to school with proof of a negative **PCR** COVID test or an alternate diagnosis from a medical practitioner.
- If parents choose not to have their child tested, the student is presumed positive and must stay home for 10 days, be fever-free for 24 hours without fever-reducing medication, and have improvement of symptoms before returning to school.
- If a student or anyone else living in the home tests positive, all students in the home (unless vaccinated and not showing symptoms) must quarantine for the 10 days of the positive person's isolation PLUS an additional 10 days quarantine, a total of 20 days. If the positive person can isolate away from the students, the other students in the home must quarantine for 10 days from the last contact with the positive person.
- Parents are asked to notify the school if a student later develops symptoms or tests positive for COVID.
- If your child is identified as a close contact to someone outside the home, follow the directions from the health department.

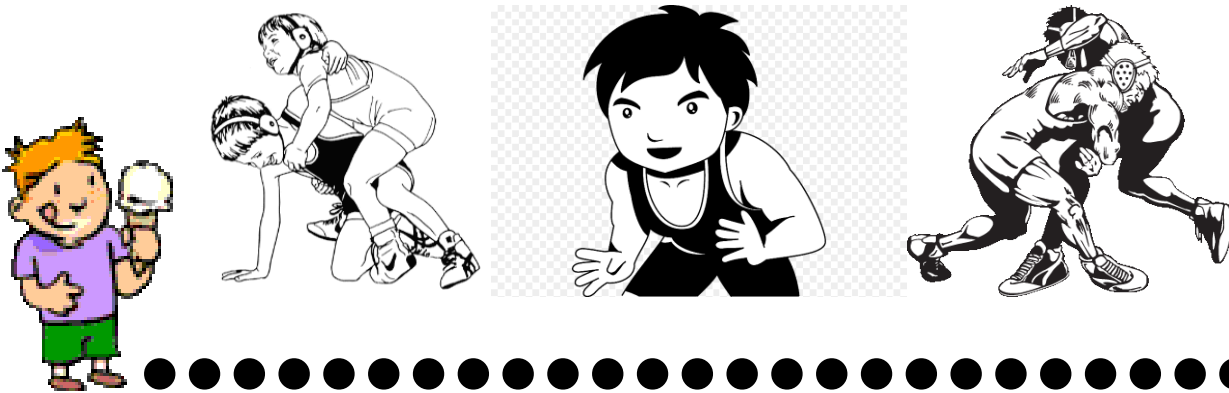

2021-2022 Wausau West Traveling Basketball

Wausau West Boys Basketball offers competitive traveling teams for boys in grades 3rd - 8th Grade. It is the goal of the Wausau West Boys Basketball program to create a fun and positive learning experience for our youth basketball players while still building players fundamental skills and developing a competitive mindset.

We are changing how we handle our Traveling Team Basketball Uniform situation. You will be purchasing your son's uniform and it is for them to keep and reuse throughout their years of playing Traveling Basketball. We highly suggest that you order the uniform a little bigger so that they get multiple years of use out of the uniform. Your uniform package that you will be purchasing includes a Jersey & Shorts along with a shooting shirt. Information and Pricing is listed below.

Season Length

Fee - Financial assistance available if needed

3rd - 4th Grade: November - February	\$125.00 (includes Uniform, shooting shirt, 5 Warrior Cards)
5th - 6th Grade: November - Early March	\$150.00 (includes shooting shirt, 5 Warrior Cards)
7th - 8th Grade: January - March	\$150.00 (includes shooting shirt, 5 Warrior Cards)

Family Discount:

1st child Cost = Price above which includes Shooting Shirt + Warrior cards
Per additional Child Cost = \$75 which includes Shooting Shirt

Program Structure

3rd - 4th Grade

- Team Split evenly and all players play in every game as evenly as possible
- Will play in 4 to 6 tournaments, with possible scrimmages throughout the season
- A select team will be formed after the last tournament is played, Select team will consist of 10 players who will be chosen by the Wausau West coaching staff. Select team will play in 1-2 additional tournaments.
- Season Runs from November - February

5th - 6th Grade

- 5th grade will be split evenly and all players will play in every game, playing time will not always be equal.
- 6th grade team creation will be based on player skill level, if teams can be split evenly they will be. Playing time will not always be equal. Creation of teams will be decided by the Wausau West coaching Staff.
- Will play in 6 - 8 tournaments (around 20 games)
- Season runs November - late February/Early March

7th - 8th Grade

- Teams will be divided based on Skill/Ability. Teams determined by Wausau West coaching staff.
- Will play in 6 - 8 tournaments (around 20 games)
- Season runs from November - March.

Practice Structure - Practice is mandatory

- 3rd - 5th grades will practice 2 times per week (Monday/Thursday or Tuesday/Thursday) - 5:30-7:00 or 7:00-8:30
- 6th - 8th grade will practice 2 times per week (Monday/Thursday or Tuesday/Thursday)- 5:30-7:00 or 7:00-8:30
- 6th - 8th grade will also have a skills practice once a week, This will be combined with another team and/or grade
