SWAHS Student Clubs and Groups

As a way to build community across SWAHS, we will be starting student clubs and groups that will meet twice a month during advisory or during 5th period lab classes. Clubs and groups were voted on by the student body, reviewed by the student ambassador group, and then presented to staff members for feedback. As we continue to plan, we are looking at late October as a starting timeframe for these opportunities. Students will have the option to sign up for a club or group of interest and adjust if they so desire within the first two meetings. On these days students will always have the opportunity to take part in a lab class, if they do not want to take part in the clubs and/or groups.

Free Vault COVID - 29 Testing Kits

Students can get a Free Vault Covid-19 Saliva Test Kit from the school health office. Only one test can be sent home at a time, and it needs to be returned the week you request it.

How Vault COVID-19 Testing Works:

- Pick up a Vault COVID-19 test at no cost from the school health office
- Create a Vault account with a username and password
- Complete the COVID-19 test at home with help from Vault test supervisors over Zoom
- Students under 18 will need a parent or legal guardian present at the time of the test to provide consent
- The test needs to be done with Zoom on Wednesday night or Thursday morning
- Seal the sample tube and place it in the biohazard bag
- Bring completed and sealed tests to the school's health office before 1pm on designated collection days
- Staff at school cannot help students administer the test.
 The test must be completed and sealed prior to bringing it into a school building

Upcoming Vault COVID-19 Test Collection Days:

- · Thursday, Sept. 30
- Thursday, Oct. 7
- Thursday, Oct. 14

The test kits from the school are only for student use and must be sent in on the designated Thursdays. You can't mail these back on a different day.

If you would like free family Covid-19 Test at Home kits from the Minnesota Department of Health, you can request them to be sent directly to your house and you drop completed tests off at a UPS location. These kits are turned in on your own and can't be accepted by the school. COVID-19 Test at Home. * They look the same but are coded differently so be careful not to mix them up.
