Welcome: Mr. Martini

· Counseling Center: Mr. Brown reports PCCR for 9th Graders and Parents will begin on September 20th. Topics concerning graduation requirements, high school, student interest, and information on scholarships. The Counselors will be visiting 7th grade classes near the end of September, to discuss stress management, and What's best for "YOU". Counselors will follow up about a question asked about foreign language and 1st year students at the high school being ask to combined with 2nd year students, some students in high school classes are doing college concurrent enrollment so 1st year students should be advised to take foreign language in junior high, even though it is not required.
