- Our IB Program is a 2-year academic program that spans junior and senior years via coursework in the disciplines of language arts, language acquisition, history, science, math, and electives.
- It is an advanced, rigorous program designed to enrich students' learning and prepare them for success at the university level while supporting their intellectual growth and curiosity.
- Successful completion of the program leads to the IB Diploma, which is highly valued by colleges and universities as a mark of distinction and an excellent indicator of post-secondary readiness.
- Students decide in the spring of their sophomore year if they would like to join the IB Program for their junior and senior years.

Academic Letter Awards for 2020-2021

Physics Club project for spaceplane payload



Centaurus High School's Physics Club submitted a proposal for Dawn Aerospace's "Paint Your Plane" competition in 2020 and won a payload for the spaceplane. The Physics Club decided to focus their research on direct sampling and analyzing the mesosphere, an upper layer of the atmosphere with few observations due to the specialized aircraft and instrumentation needed to sample air at that altitude; members aim to increase climate change research in the mesosphere and by sending their project on a spaceplane, they can study this under-observed atmospheric layer.

The club began planning the project while meeting remotely last school year and they now meet regularly in person with groups focusing on air intake, data analysis and engineering. They have partnered with local scientists and mentors from National Ocean and Atmospheric Administration as well as Ball Aerospace as they tackle the project's many challenges.

The group is hoping to fund their work by collecting a goal of \$5000 in donations this month.
