Principal Update

Super Wednesday – October 13, 2021

We will be administering the PSAT and the SAT to high school students. Super Wednesday will be an asynchronous learning day for any student NOT taking one of the tests.

- Students in grades 6-9 will stay home and follow instructions they've been given by their teachers.
- All students in Grade 10 will attend school and take the PSAT.
- Grade 11, students may choose to attend school and take the PSAT. Non-testers will stay home.
- Grade 12, students may choose to attend school and take the SAT. Nontesters will stay home.

All 9th grade students staying home on Super Wednesday, October 13, are being asked to attend this one-hour event. Attending this event will record your attendance for the day. The event will be facilitated by two Technology Integration Specialists and will address online tracking. The content is connected to district technology standards.

While the TikTok challenge may seem like an innocent prank to students, it has serious consequences. Not only is the damage expensive to repair, stolen items are difficult to replace during the pandemic.

Additional TikTok challenges are planned for the rest of the school year, including those that promote physical violence against educators and school staff, vandalism and even physical/sexual assault. Any action resulting in theft, destruction of property or assault will be dealt with in accordance with the Student Rights Handbook.
