Hello Samantha Smith Families,

This next week is Conference Week. Monday the 11th, Tuesday the 12th and Thursday the 14th are short days due to conferences. School is dismissed at 11:50am these conference days. On conference days, no school lunch is served. PLEASE NOTE, Wednesday is a regular Wednesday schedule releasing students at 1:50pm. There will be NO SCHOOL Friday the 15th as we will spend the day training our staff. If you are unsure of your student's conference time via Teams, please reach out to their teacher.

Please help our school stay safe. If your child is sick, keep them home. If your child has any of these symptoms, they must stay home. If they are not kept home, they will be sent home.

Covid Symptoms:

- Fever of 100.4 or above (a student does not have to have a fever to have Covid)
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Chills
- Fatigue
- Muscle pain or body aches
- Headache
- Loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

COVID-19 Absence Scenarios

There are various scenarios your student may experience this year as they relate to COVID-19 related absences. **The biggest change is that students who experience one or more COVID-19 symptoms will be required to quarantine until the symptoms are gone and/or they have received a negative COVID-19 test (must be a PCR test).** This requirement will have a greater impact on our school as we enter the cold/flu season. Also starting next week, once your student is either home sick or sent home sick, you will be contacted by a District Contact Tracer. This person will be your point person regarding return to school date/timeline. If you are finding you are not hearing from them and you have negative test results for your student, you can email myself at jwarner@lwsd.org. Please read below so you are aware of the various scenarios that may take place.

- Scenario 1: Student is required to quarantine at home due to being in close contact with someone who was COVID-19 positive and/or being COVID-19 positive themselves.
- This is the most straight forward scenario – the **student will qualify for our COVID-19 support plan** as outlined below and be out for 10-14 days.
- Scenario 2: Student is sent home for having a single COVID-19 symptom and parents *choose not to have* their student take a COVID-19 test.
- As of 9/27 students will be required to quarantine if they have a single COVID-19 symptom. If the family does not want to test their student, the student will be required to quarantine for a minimum of 10 days. **In this case the COVID support plan outlined below WOULD be in effect.**

- Scenario 3: Student is sent home for having a single COVID-19 symptom and parents indicate they *will have* their child take a COVID-19 test.
- As of 9/27 students will be required to quarantine if they have a single COVID-19 symptom. Our COVID Support Plan can take up to 48 hours to get started. If test results take longer than the 48 hours to receive, **the COVID support plan outlined below WOULD be in effect**. The COVID-19 support plan would also go into effect if the student's test came back positive.

COVID-19 Support Plan for Students Required to Quarantine

The following supports will be provided to students who are out multiple days due to a school required multiple day COVID-19 absence.

- A computer will be assigned for the student to use at home
 - Computers will be assigned for pick-up within 48 hours of quarantine
- Teachers will provide 1-2 live “look-in” opportunities each day for students to access via Microsoft Teams
 - Live “look-ins” times/Teams meetings will begin within 48 hours of quarantine
 - Live “look-in” meetings will be approximately 10-15 minutes in length in a core content area, as determined by the grade level team
 - Teams meeting invites will be communicated to families for the live “look-ins” within 48 hours of quarantine
- A weekly plan for learning including assignments and assessments
 - Teachers will communicate with families on these items

Highly Capable Services

Lake Washington School District provides accelerated academic programs for students in kindergarten through 12th grade. These programs are designed to meet the learning styles and needs of students with exceptional intellectual, academic, and creative abilities. Information about accelerated programs can be

The process for screening students for accelerated programs will look slightly different this year. All students in grades K-5 will be screened for our highly capable programs using FastBridge Universal Screening assessment. Information regarding the screening process is included below.

Highly Capable Eligibility Process:

- September - October: Screening with FastBridge assessment is administered to all students at their home school in grades K-5 for both reading and math.
- October - December: Students who score in the 85th percentile in both reading and math will receive a letter inviting them to participate in the second round of the screening process. This round will consist of students taking either the NNAT and the Iowa assessments at their home school.
