director's note BEDTIME STORIES

lot of research has been done about the benefits of being read to. In general, children who are read to early and often develop language skills earlier, concentrate better, and tend to do better in school. They're more likely to become lifelong readers. It's calming to be read to. It gives us a sense of wellbeing and strengthens our bond with the reader. It's not coincidental that story telling is the essential work of all theatre artists, and "story theatre" is nothing new.

In 1993 I fell in with a company of Seattle actors who were in the process of building Book-It Repertory Theatre. Book-It's mission is "transforming great literature into great theatre through simple and sensitive production and to inspiring its audiences to read". In the early days we would gather short stories and try to stage them, word for word. This meant incorporating narrative into the dialogue, including all the "he said"s and "she said"s. Over time the company began adapting fulllength novels and producing three to five world premiere shows a year. During my decade as a core company member I performed in Grendel, Lady Chatterley's Lover, Sweet Thursday, and Snow Falling on Cedars among others. I also paid dues to cover rent, sold program ads, coordinated

volunteers and co-created a residency program at Roosevelt High School. We wore a lot of hats.

Book-It's audience and profile grew. It's kind of a local treasure. Their scripts are produced in schools and professional theatres all over the country. What hasn't changed is the theatre's mission, and its commitment to honoring the author's voice.

Emma was first produced in 2009 and was remounted in 2015. It's arguably the most comedic of Jane Austen's books, and the most accessible, featuring colorful characters with interesting blind spots. To me it's a story about coming of age and learning to take the high road. Our production has two principal ensembles, and it's been a unique challenge to get both casts ready while working in a new style.

I knew when I started at Kennedy Catholic in 2015 that eventually we would have to do one of their scripts. I haven't performed with Book-It in a few years, but I try to get back to see what they're up to from time to time. When I sit in that audience, or this one, I'm reminded of the simple pleasure of being told a bedtime story, and I usually have interesting dreams afterward. I hope you enjoy Emma, and that you have good dreams.
