Korea International School (KIS) is a private, non-profit, nonsectarian school offering an American college preparatory curriculum. KIS was established in 2000 and is located in a state-of-the-art facility in the rapidly growing southern Seoul suburb of Pangyo. Admission is selective.

RESPONSE TO COVID

Korea International School (KIS) moved to a synchronous, distance learning model from Feb 25 through May 2020 when students returned to campus on a staggered schedule. In the 2020-21 and 2021-22 school years KIS has been in a hybrid model. Learning targets and grade level expectations remain the same during our virtual campus model in each course. Student achievement continues to be reported on the academic transcript using the same A - F grading scale. KIS athletics, performances, and clubs have been accessible on a limited basis.

Students enrolled in AP courses are required to take the corresponding AP exam.

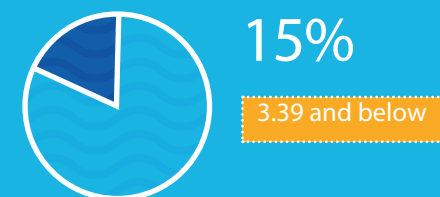
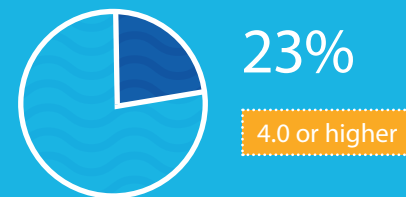
