For a school receiving Title I funds, parents have the right to know:


The professional qualifications of their child's teachers and paraprofessionals; and Whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or other provisional status through which State qualification or licensing criteria have been waived.

Parent Engagement Requirements



Annual Meeting

Federal guidelines require Title I schools to hold a parent meeting to explain and discuss the Title I program and requirements.



The School District and all Title I schools must allocate at least one percent (1%) of the Title I budget towards programs and activities.

Title I schools are required to collaborate with parents in the School-Parent Compact and Parent Involvement Policy.

- Provide materials and training to improve their child's achievement.
