Summer School Online Report

Intent

The aim of the CWS Summer School was to help current Year 6 students pastorally as they make the transition to secondary school, whilst also supporting them academically following the disruption that they have faced in school because of COVID-19.

Implementation

Summer school ran from the 23rd to the 27th of August 2021.

Students attended the summer school from 9.30am to 2.30pm each day.

Over the course of the week, all students participated in lessons on literacy and numeracy, as well as co-curricular activities and assemblies. Each day focused on a different CWS core value (Teamwork, Respect, Enjoyment, Discipline and Sportsmanship).

The summer school at CWS was staffed by qualified teachers and teaching assistants, as well as administrative staff. To ensure the safety and wellbeing of all the students who attended, each day at least one member of senior leadership was present and a designated safeguarding lead.

Attendance:

- 100 places were offered to the incoming Year 7 cohort to attend a summer school at CWS during the week commencing 23rd August.
- 99 students signed up to attend summer school.
- Actual attendance was slightly lower than expected - in total, 90 students attended summer school, with 1 out of the 90 only being absent for three days out of the five for COVID-19 related reasons.
- 27 students who attended summer school were classified as pupil premium.
- There was a roughly even split between boys and girls.
- Between 6 and 7 students with EHCPs attended each day.

Finance:

Based upon the daily rate of £59.70 per pupil, we estimate that we are entitled to £26,685.90 in funding from the DfE. We will, however, only be claiming for £14,609.39.
