If you answered YES to some of the above questions, you may be eligible for a Parcel Tax Exemption on future Property Tax Bills.

APPLICATIONS FOR EXEMPTION WILL BE ACCEPTED BETWEEN NOVEMBER 1ST AND JUNE 30TH FOR THE NEXT TAX YEAR

You must provide the documents below in order for your application to be processed:

- ✓ Copy of current Property Tax Bill (front and back), both bills if claiming contiguous parcels
- ✓ Proof of age for Senior Citizen Exemption (e.g. driver's license, passport, birth certificate, etc.)
- ✓ Additional document showing proof of address (utility bill, telephone bill, etc.) Name(s) on property tax bill, additional proof of address, and proof of age (if applicable) must match.

If you do not have access to e-mail or a printer, please call our office at 408-227-8300 ext. 100217 and request an application to be mailed to you.

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Three options are available to apply for an exemption (In Person, By Mail, By E-mail):

- 1. In Person come to the District Office at 6578 Santa Teresa Blvd. with the above documentation.
- 2. **By mail** click on the Parcel Tax Link on the District website at www.ogsd.net and print the application. Mail the application and copies of your documents to the District Office address located at 6578 Santa Teresa Blvd, San Jose, CA 95119.
- 3. **By e-mail** click on the Parcel Tax Link on the District website at www.ogsd.net and print the Senior Citizen Exemption Application Form. Sign and complete the application form and e-mail with your supporting documents to www.business_support_services@oakgrovesd.net.

How do I stay on the exempt list? What do I do now?

After your application has been processed, your parcel number will be added to the exemption list and the parcel tax will be removed from <u>future</u> property tax bills. <u>Do not deduct the parcel tax amount from your current property tax payment</u>. Your parcel number will remain on the exempt list until there is a change in property ownership. **You do not need to do anything to remain on the exempt list.**
