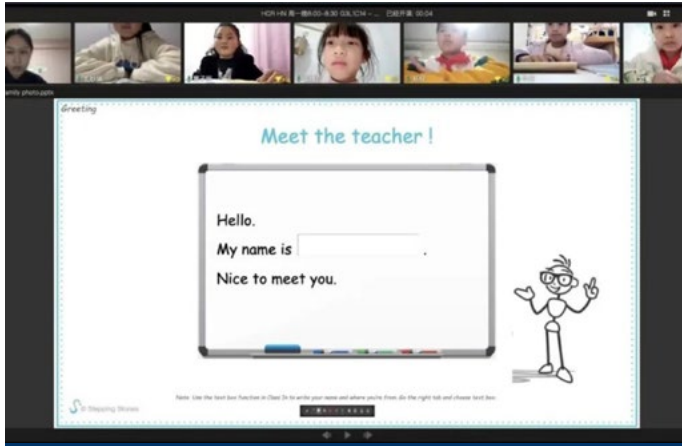

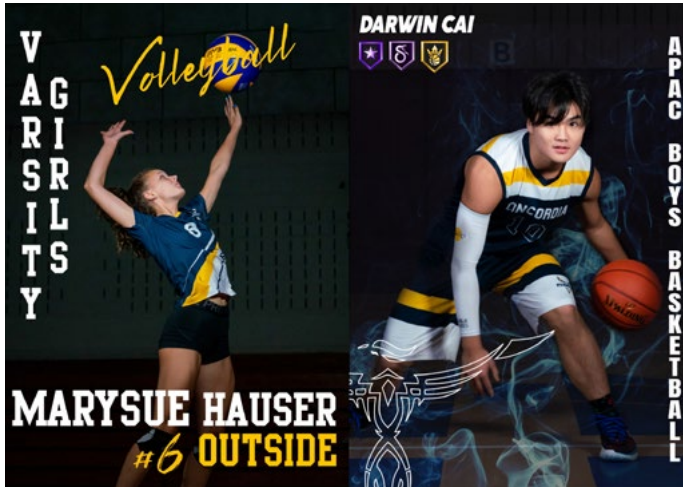
SMS Visual Graphics focuses on graphic design (mainly APAC individual student posters) + peer mentoring

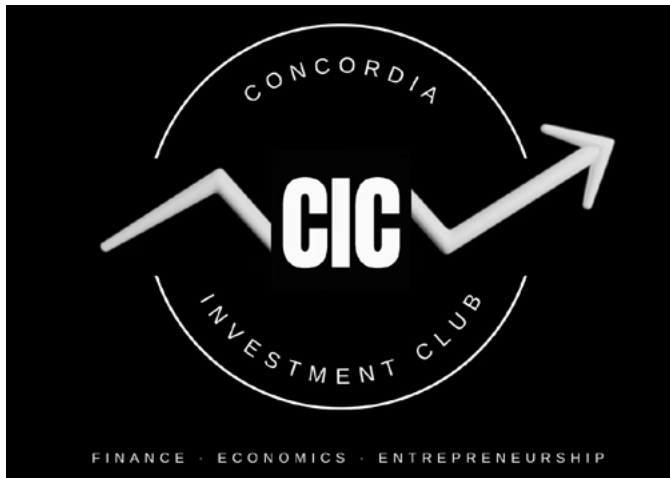

Concordia Investment Club (previously Concordia Capital Club)

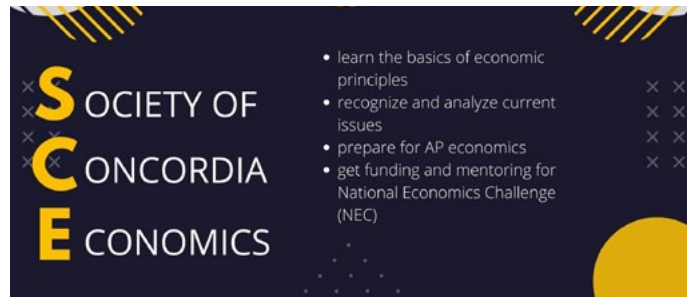

Ficticity Creative Writing Club

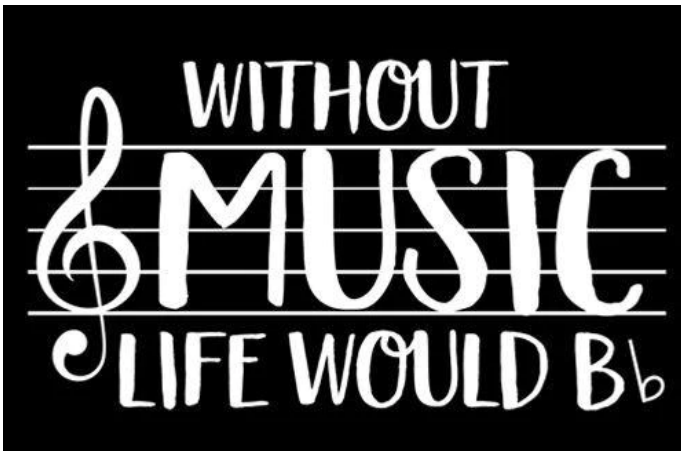

Conchord Chromatics

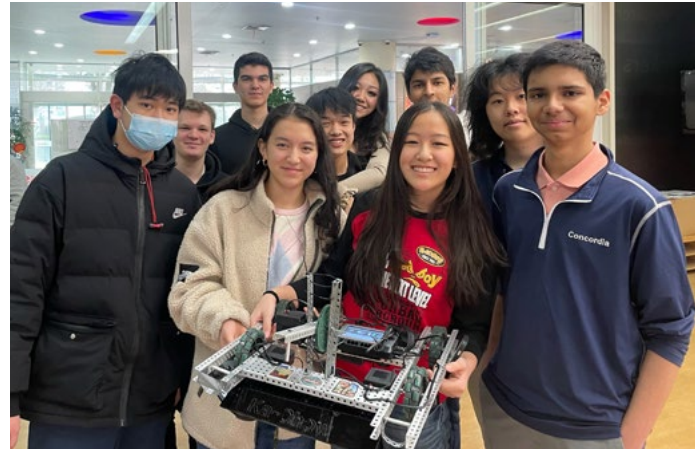

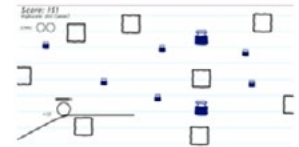
