

VETERAN DIPLOMAS

In order for a veteran to receive a "Veteran's" diploma from the Oxnard Union High School District, the following are required:

1. That person must have been an active member of the United States armed forces subsequent to September 16, 1940, and have served therein for not less than 90 days.
2. The veteran must have completed tests of General Education Development (high school level) prepared by the American Council on Education, with an average standard score of 45 or above on the five tests in the battery, and with a standard score of 40 or above on each of the five test in the battery.
3. The student must have 10 credits in U.S. History, 5 credits in American Government, 5 credits in Economics and 5 credits in Health Education.
4. The student must present an official transcript of credits earned in a high school.
5. The student must have lived in California one year and in this high school district six months.
6. The student must be at least 20 years of age, or, if a former student of the Oxnard Union High School District, be eligible four years after entrance in the high school.

Veterans who establish satisfactory scores in United States Armed Forces Institute examinations in American History, Government, Economics, and Health Education, may be declared as having met the district and state requirements in those subjects.

Candidates for graduation shall earn at least 15 credits in the Oxnard Adult School. Diplomas will be granted through the adult School program.
