Board moves forward in superintendent search

The Board of Education is moving forward in its search for a new superintendent of schools, and hopes to announce Charles County Public Schools' new top administrator on April 9.

The new superintendent is replacing long-time Superintendent James E. Richmond, who told the Board in April 2012 he would not be seeking renewal of his contract for another four-year term and would be leaving the school system at the end of the 2012-13 school year.

The Board has completed its review of applicants and one round of interviews. Members say they hope to name three finalists by March 12. Names of finalists will be released at the Board meeting on March 12

and during an orientation session for community and school system focus groups that will provide the Board feedback about the candidates.

Earlier this school year, the Board, through its hiring consultants with the Maryland Association of Boards of Education (MABE), held a series of five open forums for employees and community members to provide characteristics they look for in a superintendent. The Board advertised nationally and locally for candidates.

Following a series of focus group sessions March 18-20, the Board hopes to select a candidate and then announce the final selection on April 9 during the monthly Board meeting.

La Plata going to worlds

A team of students from La Plata High School will compete at the 2013 Vex Robotics High School World Championship next month after being named tournament champions at the 2013 College of Southern Maryland Robotics Challenge Vex League Championship held Feb. 16 at the La Plata campus.

During the event, the top 15 ranked teams from qualification matches picked alliance partners from other teams to compete with in elimination rounds. The winners of the elimination rounds were named tournament champions. The "Angle Warriors – 5977A" team from La Plata partnered with the "A-Team" from Calvert High School to earn the champion title. Both teams advance to the national event scheduled for April 17-20 in Anaheim. California.

Superintendent of the Year, became Superintendent of Charles County Public Schools (CCPS) in 1996 as interim Superintendent. He was appointed to his first four-year term as Superintendent in 1997, and he will complete his fourth and final term on June 30, 2013. Richmond first started with CCPS in 1966 as a social studies teacher at La Plata High School.

Maryland law requires Boards to award a four-year contract, and the new superintendent's term will begin July 1, 2013, and end June 30, 2017.
