# BOYS FIRST, GIRLS SECOND AT OAKLAND COUNTY XC MEET; VOLLEYBALL CONTINUES UNBEATEN STREAK

# BOYS TAKE FIRST, GIRLS SECOND AT OAKLAND COUNTY

The Notre Dame Boys and Girls Varsity Cross Country teams finished first and second, respectively, among all Division Two, Three, and Four schools at the Oakland County Championship held at Kensington Metropark. The Boys had to beat out perennial rivals Orchard Lake St. Marys, Cranbrook and Country Day to secure the title. The Irish were once again led by sophomore Wade Robinson whose 17:35 time placed him 21st overall, earning All-County honors for the second year in a row. Junior captain Ben Kinkade finished with a 18:35, just three seconds from a personal record despite the notoriously difficult course which features multiple steep hills. Troy Kilanowski ran strong, improving his time from a previous Kensington race by 50 seconds. Freshmen Sam Phillips, Chris Hunter, Isaak Brook, and Ryan Wojichowski rounded out the varsity team that features six freshman and sophomores among the top seven. The Girls team, which ran shorthanded, finished second behind Marian, who the Irish will see later in the year at Regionals. Sophomore Zoe Hoke beat a quartet of top runners from DI Walled Lake Central, Walled Lake Northern, Farmington and Troy by 1.5 seconds to finish 28th and grab All-County Honors, which are awarded to the top 30 athletes in the county from all divisions. Freshman Maria Nunning and Senior Anna Hauck laid down strong performances with Nunning improving her time by one minute versus her previous Kensington race. Adri Lorenz, Kate Stacey and Addie Bellows rounded out the Varsity lineup for the girls. The next race for the Irish will be the 37th Annual Gabriel Richard Cross Country Invitational at Hudson Mills Metropark in Dexter.

# IRISH CONTINUE WIN STREAK WITH QUAD SWEEP

The Notre Dame Varsity Volleyball team picked up three more wins, sweeping a quad also featuring Goodrich, Eisenhower, and Bronson that was played using a best-of-five format. The Irish started the day with a 25-9, 25-14, 25-8 win over the Martians. Josie Bloom led the charge with four aces, 12 points, 16 receptions and 13 digs. Aly Borellis was right behind with three aces, 10 points, six kills, and 26 assists and Bianca Giglio led all attackers with 10 kills. In the second match, the Irish came away with a 25-3, 25-12, 25-9 over Eisenhower. Leah Greif led Notre Dame from the service line with an ace and 12 points while dishing out 15 assists. Aly Berent not far behind with three aces and 10 points while Bloom frustrated the Eagle attackers with 18 digs. In the final match, Notre Dame earned a 25-13, 25-16, 25-19 over Bronson, currently ranked fifth in Division Three. Borellis once again was solid for Notre Dame, adding four aces, 14 points, 12 kills, 19 assists, two blocks and nine digs to her impressive totals. Elyssa Wallace served up a pair of aces to go with 13 points, six receptions and four digs while Sophia Sudzina and Giglio each chipped in with 9 kills.

# IRISH SET SHUTOUT WIN OVER COBRAS

The Notre Dame Varsity Football team moved to 6-1 with a 58-0 shutout win over Detroit University Prep Math & Science. The Irish scored three times in the first quarter with touchdowns coming on a 21 yard pass from Jacob Tuttle to Johnny Dreer, a six yard run by Jeremy Gale, and a 19 yard pass from Tuttle to Bradon Prater. Notre Dame extended the lead in the second quarter with a 67 yard run by Chris Galle, a safety by Evan Noga, and a four yard run by Evan McGhee. In the third quarter, Alex Scherle caught a 26 yard touchdown from Tuttle and Aaron McGhee ran for a 10 yard score and Zach Mylenek added a 45 yard rushing touchdown in the fourth quarter to cap off the scoring.


# IRISH SET SHUTOUT WIN OVER COBRAS

The Notre Dame Varsity Volleyball team defeated Rochester 25-5, 25-12, 25-20 on Parents' Night. A pair of Miss Volleyball finalists played well in the last regular season home match. Josie Bloom served up nine points and collected four assists to go with a team high 14 receptions and 16 digs. With those 14 serve receptions, Bloom surpassed 400 on the season with only 24 errors. Aly Borellis led all attackers with 11 kills, three blocks, two service points, 18 assists and four digs. Borellis ranks first in the state and fourth in the nation in hitting percentage at .526. Leah Greif added four aces and 12 points while assisting on six kills. Elyssa Wallace was right behind with 11 service points and four aces. Bianca Giglio and Sophia Sudzina collected 10 and six kills, respectively, with Grace Wenaas kicking in four and Abby Nellis and Sara Nouhan adding three each. Nellis also had a team high four blocks. The Irish will head to the challenging Beast of the East tournament this weekend.

# JV VOLLEYBALL GOES 3-0 AT FINAL POWER SERIES

The Notre Dame JV Volleyball team went 3-0 at the Mercy Power Series over the weekend to finish the season-long slate 8-1 at the competition. The Irish started the day with a come-from-behind 19-25, 25-23, 15-7 win over Anchor Bay. Mya Kattula had 12 serving points and five kills, Bree Blakeslee had four kills, Gigi Nadeau and Audrey Thummel had strong games from the service line and at the net, and Anastacia Wachowiak and Natalia Green both had several digs. Notre Dame defeated Romeo 25-22, 25-21 in the second match. Strong serving from Blakeslee, Nadeau, Kattula, and Thummel helped lead the Iris to the win. Thummel, Kattula, Nadeau, Keira Maher, and Green all had multiple kills, Ryann Simmonds was strong on the defensive end, and Wachowiak had a key dig that led to the game winning point in the opening match. In the final match of the day, the Irish defeated Flushing by identical scores of 25-16, 25-16. Nadeau had six serving points, including two aces, in the opening set while Wachowiak added four. Nadeau and Thummel led the offense with three kills each. Wachowiak added seven serving points, with three aces, in game two while Simmonds and Thummel each had three.
