#### Anointing of the Sick: at all Masses Oct. 16-17 Sat 4pm, Sun 8am, 10am, 12pm, 5pm

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick gives the grace of the Holy Spirit to those who are sick. This grace helps the whole person, not only to bear the suffering but also to quiet anxiety, dissipate fear, and inspire confidence in God and acceptance of his will. When the Sacrament is celebrated communally, those who are sick, experiencing the frailty of old age, recovering from addictions, or preparing for a serious medical procedure, come before the community in faith to be anointed with the Oil of the Infirm and prays over them. The community, in a solemn praver of faith intercedes for those who are being anointed and prays for healing of body.

The special graces of God in the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick have these effects in those who open their lives to God:

- The uniting of the sick person to the passion of Christ

**MEDICARE/HOSPICE CARE** – This is the last of a short series on what is and <u>isn't</u> included when one is in hospice and has Medicare. The following things are NOT covered by Medicare once your hospice benefit starts:

- <u>Treatment intended to cure your terminal illness and/</u> <u>or related conditions</u>. Talk with your doctor if you're thinking about getting treatment to cure your illness. As a hospice patient, you always have the right to stop hospice care at any time.
- <u>Prescription drugs to cure your illness</u> (rather than for symptom control or pain relief).
- <u>Care from any hospice provider that wasn't set up by</u> <u>the hospice medical team.</u> You must get hospice care from the hospice provider you choose. All care that you get for your terminal illness must be given by or arranged by the hospice team. You can't get the same type of hospice care from a different hospice, unless you change your hospice provider. However, you can still see your regular doctor or nurse practitioner if you've chosen him or her to be the attending medical professional who helps supervise your hospice care.
- <u>Room and board.</u> Medicare doesn't cover room and board if you get hospice care in your home or if you live in a nursing home or a hospice inpatient facility. If the hospice team determines that you need short-term inpatient or respite care services that they arrange, Medicare will cover your stay in the facility. You may have to pay a small copayment for the respite stay.
- <u>Care you get as a hospital outpatient (like in an</u> <u>emergency room)</u>, care you get as a hospital inpatient or ambulance transportation unless it's either arranged by your hospice team or is unrelated to your terminal illness and related conditions.
- Contact your hospice team **before** you get any of these services, or you might have to pay the entire cost. This concludes the series on the subject. All of the information came from the official website of the

United States government. If you'd like to explore further, go to <u>https://www.medicare.gov</u>. It's a lot to take in, I know, but it's important to understand what the hospice benefits of Medicare are.

- Another thing to understand is that Palliative Care and Hospice Care are similar but different. <u>Palliative Care</u> focuses on relief from physical suffering. The patient may be being treated for a disease or may be living with a chronic disease and may or may not be terminally ill. This care also addresses the patient's physical, mental, social, and spiritual well-being, is appropriate in all disease stages and circumstances, and accompanies the patient from diagnosis to cure. It uses life-prolonging medications. And it uses a multidisciplinary approach using highly trained professionals. It's usually offered where the patient first sought treatment.
- <u>Hospice Care</u> is available to terminally ill participants. This care makes the patient comfortable and prepares them and the family for the end of life when it is determined treatment for the illness will no longer be pursued. It does not use life-prolong medications. It relies on a family caregiver and a visiting hospice nurse and is offered at a place the patient prefers, such as in their home, a nursing home, or occasionally, in a hospital.
