7. RECONVENE IN PUBLIC: RECPORT OF CLOSED SESSION ACTION:

The Board returned from closed session at 6:35 p.m. President Jáquez reconvened the public session and announced that no action was taken in closed session.

8. AUDIENCE TO ADDRESS THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES:

Members of the audience addressed the Board of Trustees regarding the following:

OFTSE President expressed concerns regarding the elimination of geography courses and replacing with a freshman transition course.

A teacher expressed concerns regarding the elimination of geography from the District's curriculum and replacing with a freshman transition course and said if geography courses were removed students would not meet the a-g requirements.

A teacher stated it would be a detriment to the District if the geography courses were removed from the curriculum and asked which course would replace geography. The speaker stressed that the Board receive input from the District's department chairs before taking action to remove the course, stated test scores would go down and schools would not move out of program improvement, and what process would be used to eliminate teachers.

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8. AUDIENCE TO ADDRESS THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES - Continued:

A teacher and Academic Decathlon coach reported that for the last two years the District has beat the teams over the hill in the AcaDeca competition. The speaker stated that eliminating the geography courses would prevent the AcaDeca students from receiving the geography background necessary to compete in AcaDeca, which would definitely send students over the hill to attend other districts that offer geography.

A department chairperson opined it would not be in the best interest of the District to eliminate geography courses and offering a freshman transition class would be a waste of time. The speaker stated several schools offer programs that specifically address the needs of incoming ninth graders.

A teacher opined if the District removes geography from the curriculum the students will be denied the opportunity to learn geography and said eliminating the course is not going to help the students improve as freshman.

A teacher and Union representative expressed concerns regarding the elimination of the geography courses.

9. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORTS:

9-A Regular Report: Student
Representative to the Board of
Trustees

Student Representative, Daniel T. Galang, reported no meeting was held this month for the Oxnard District Council (ODC); therefore, no information was available from the schools other than Channels Islands. He said CIHS held a winter sports stadium rally last Friday, the solar panel installation process can be seen in an area on campus and plans for the Renaissance Rally are in process with focus directed on student achievement. In response to a question asked by a member of the audience, Daniel announced yes, geography did help him during his freshman year and in the completion of his college application.

9-B Special Presentation: Air Force Junior ROTC Program

Major Dale Weaver, OHS AFJROTC Instructor presented a quick overview of the AFJROTC program via a PowerPoint presentation. He reported a Air Force program is available at OHS and a Naval program at HHS, he shared information on the mission statement, goals and core values, he reported the cadets perform in community events for veterans, compete in drill meets, and color guard at all home football games. He provided information on the civilian marksmanship program which has been in effect for 18 years at Hueneme High School and said that all program costs are borne by the Air Force.

9-C Board Report: Special Education Program Overview Director of Special Education, Mr. Kenneth Goeken, stated that based on the recommendation by California Department of Education, the District conducted a review of the Special Education programs. Via a PowerPoint report, Mr. Goeken outlined the purpose of the study that was conducted by Pivot Learning on behalf of the District. He said the Department received several commendations and key recommendations from Pivot.

Phyllis Throckmorton, Director of Career and Technology Education reported great things are happening with the District's career academies and CTE programs! Via a PowerPoint report, she presented information on 21st Century Education, Connect-Ed and partnership with the District, and critical elements for developing a system of linked learning pathways that will strengthen the District's academies. She reported the District is in the process of forming an Education Foundation to enhance business and community partnerships.

9-E Board Report: Document Management

Via a PowerPoint presentation, Deanna Rantz, Director of Purchasing provided data on the District's current document system. Currently, there are 56 copiers and 999 printers district-wide and the costs for leases, paper, toner, outsourcing, staffing, etc. are \$1,158,000.00 a year. She stated an inhouse print center would significantly reduce overall printing costs and generate revenue and the cost of construction center is estimated at \$80,000.00. In closing, Ms. Rantz reviewed next steps required to proceed in implementing a print center.

9-F Regular Report:

- Mr. Dabbs reported that members of the new Camarillo area high school committee had the opportunity to visit and tour two schools, a small high school and a performing arts magnet school.
- Mr. Puneet Sharma, Director of Information Technology presented information on Granicus mobile that will allow recording of Board meetings held at public venues.
- Mr. Stephen McFarland, Director of Maintenance, Operations, and Transportation presented an update on the solar projects. He said the RMHS inspection has been completed by SCE and permission to operate has been initiated and the OHS project is at 100+ percent generating capacity.
- Superintendent Soumakian reminded everyone that the District is focused every day, on every student, at every classroom to prepare our students for 21st century learning. In response to concerns expressed by teachers regarding the new freshman course, he stated the course is very structured and will help freshman get ready for high school.
