Prerequisite: This course is open to students in grades 9-12 with less than two years of formal English instruction or by recommendation of the teacher.

This course for English learners emphasizes strengthening and developing academic language. In addition to a study of communication skills, the course will provide intensive language practice in academic reading and writing activities. Students meet with their teachers an additional two blocks per cycle to participate in the Seminar Skills program. These students should also be enrolled in Social Studies 2.
