<u>RSE Staff</u>

The teachers and staff of Rock Spring Elementary will work with students and their families to support students' success in reading and math. Some of our key connections with families will be:

- Teachers will use email blast to inform families about learning and events taking place within the classroom.
- Grade Level newsletters and learning material will be distributed weekly via backpack mail, email, and on social media.
- Teachers will individually contact parents on an as needed basis to address student specific needs and successes via rocket folder, email, or telephone.
- Teachers will facilitate multiple meetings with families to prove individualized and group data regarding benchmark skills.
- Class Dojo will also be used School wide as another mode of communication. This promotes the Teacher/Parent connection.

RSE Students

Rock Spring Elementary students will:

- Bring home newsletters and announcements regarding Family Engagement events.
- Talk with family about new vocabulary words they are learning and play provided games to help with targeted subjects.
- Read daily to increase vocabulary and skills.

RSE Families

Rock Spring Elementary families joined with the staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' success in reading and math. Families may have other ideas that they can add to this list.

- Encourage student(s) to read independently at least 30 minutes each night.
- Check PowerSchool and grade level newsletters weekly to monitor grades and ensure students are completing assignments on time.
- Attend school-wide and grade level workshops provided by RSE to learn strategies to help student(s) at home. (Virtual until further notice)
