

## AP & CE

### Five Reasons to Take AP or CE Classes

- 1. Earn college credit in high school (so much cheaper!).
- 2. Develop knowledge & skills needed to succeed in college.
- 3. Increase the chance of graduating from college in 4 years instead of the typical 5 years.
- 4. Take classes with students who are college bound & have similar goals.
- 5. Stand out in the college admissions process.



## Certificate of Completion: What is it?

- A certificate from Weber State University stating all General Education requirements are fulfilled. CE classes are taken at NHS (approx. 35 CE credits).
- This can be presented to any Utah college or university & General Education requirements are waived, even if they are different.
  - Some private schools are excluded.

## NCAA

- Students wanting to participate in a collegiate sport at the Division I or II level must meet the requirements for NCAA.
  - 16 Course Rule = taking at least 16 credits of approved core classes.
  - Maintain a 2.3 GPA in those classes.
  - Must submit an ACT score to the NCAA.
  - Talk with your counselor to go over requirements in detail.
- Students and parents are responsible to ensure NCAA eligibility!

## **CTE** Career Pathways

CTE Pathways help students focus on & prepare for a career. Completing a Career Pathway in high school can help students transition into their post-high school education or career.

Student must participate in a CTSO (Career Technical Student Organization) to receive the "Pathway Completer" recognition at graduation.


