Our Mission

Doane Academy, an independent Episcopal day school, prekindergarten through 12th grade, provides an exceptional college preparatory program while cultivating character development and nurturing the emotional maturity essential in preparing students for life. We develop intelligent, capable individuals within a community where all are known, loved, and strongly encouraged to discover their unique potential.

Signature Programs

Lead Onward Program

Comprised of a series of eight required trimester-length courses, this program asks students to grapple with the challenges we must overcome to create a more just world. Through their coursework, underclassmen consider the values that define their generation and how systems and belief structures impact progress. Juniors further develop the research and listening skills needed to weigh a single complex topic such as gun violence or the national reckoning around monuments. Through their work, they learn to consider a range of differing opinions and search for nuanced answers that include others, even those who disagree with them. Having completed this work, seniors then spend two trimesters learning how to facilitate inclusive discussions before leading hour-long, seminar-style sessions around an issue of social justice. All upper school students participate in these seminars, and seniors guide the conversation, enforce interaction norms, and resolve conflicts.

Rocks, Roots, and Wings Trips

All upper school students begin each year by going on grade-level outdoor education trips that take them beyond the boundaries of campus to places of historical, natural, and cultural significance. Pushed out of their

comfort zones by design, students test their limits and discover their second winds, and at the end of these trips, they find that their self-confidence, willingness to take initiative, team work, and maturity are significantly enhanced. Activities include whitewater rafting, canoeing, environmental education, hiking, cycling, ropes courses, team building exercises, and community service.

School Family

While many schools try to minimize interactions between their oldest and youngest community members, Doane consciously creates consistent opportunities for students to interact across all grade levels in a safe and caring environment. Doane students are placed into one of thirteen school families, each of which is comprised of students from our prekindergarten program through grade 12. Students remain in the same family throughout their time at Doane, and as they make crafts, read stories, play board games, and celebrate each other, they create friendships that grow, evolve, and deepen over years. Through these friendships, the School Family program reminds older Doane students of the opportunity and responsibility they have to serve as role models for younger peers.

The Arts

Because of the powerful ways in which the arts unlock creativity and build resilience, Doane places them equal to other academic courses and allows students to pursue multiple courses of artistic study. Students can choose to take an Arts Major course and an Arts Minor course. Courses designated as Major (1 credit) meet five times every ten days, and courses designated as Minor (.5 credit) meet four times every ten days. Standout programs include our band, in which 25% of upper school students typically participate, and our partnership with Studio Incamminati, a Philadelphia-based School for Contemporary Realist Art founded by Nelson Shanks for the training of professional artists.

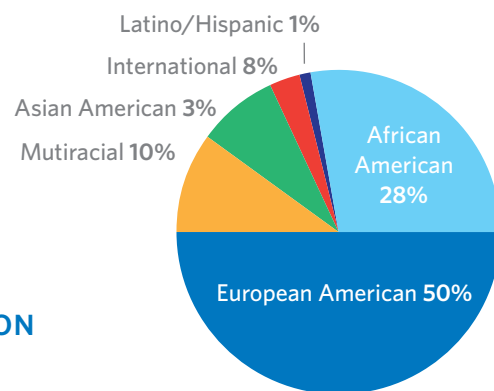

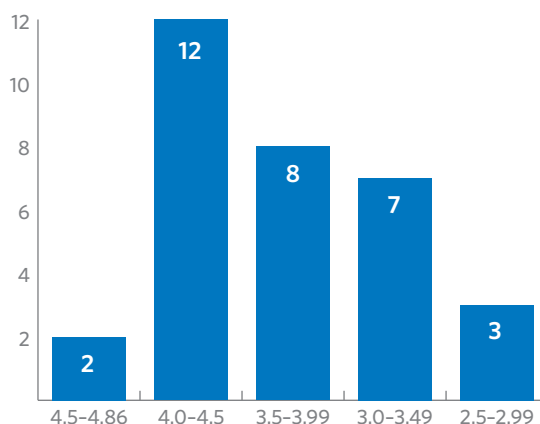
