

Parking Lot»

Your child's safety is our #1 priority.
Parking lot etiquette is expected from all of our families, your child's caregivers and your extended family. Please remember to drive:

- Without your phone.
- Slowly (9 mph).
- Carefully.

Please work on the life skills of crossing roads and navigating a parking lot safely with your student.

For pick up and drop off instructions, please see the school plan.

Parents can provide their children permission to walk or bike ride to/from school as appropriate, given age of child.

We will continue on our staggered drop-off and pick-up times assigned by grade levels. This year, older siblings' start and end time will be assigned to correspond with that of their youngest attending sibling to provide the greatest convenience for parents.

In order to ensure the families are able to park and retrieve their children at the appropriate time, we ask that parents or caretakers pick up children and immediately proceed home.

Field Trips»

What is the school field trip uniform? Why is this required?

We do not have any field trips scheduled for the 2021–2022 school year, however, if circumstances change, here's our field trip uniform: Black pants or skirt, white shirt with Aspen Academy logo. When we take our students into the community, we are proudly representing our school as well as optimizing the safety of each child. Personal Instruction Profile. Each student's PIP is written by teachers after an extended assessment process. The PIP contains: a student's strengths, areas of focus, and their yearly goals. PIPs are delivered to your email a week prior to Fall Conferences.







Aspen Leadership Institute(ALI)

The Aspen Leadership Institute is Aspen Academy's secret sauce that allows our alumni to have a strong emphasis on leadership and entrepreneurial development. Our cornerstone curriculum content with Bear's Student Entreprises (BSE), Student Mentor Project, Service Learning, Entrepreneurs Expo, AMP'd and Future Holders' daily content lessons, were written to honor the inherent worth and infinite potential of each and every one of our students.

Bear's Student Enterprises

Our capstone program in which 8th grade students operate a variety of businesses on campus including the Bear's store, Bear's cafe, broadcasting to put on AMP'd.

Student Mentor Project

Every year, each student has the opportunity to either be a mentor or mentee. Our older students, in grades 4–8, are often seen interacting, reading, teaching and sitting alongside their mentee in grades Pre–K – 3. This relationship holds strong through the school year as they attend events together as well as play games and fun activities in relation to our leadership topics.

Service Learning

Our students are taught skills and participate in activities that enable them to become engaged members of the local and global community. The Aspen Academy student body participates in over 7,000 hours of service learning annually and is involved with age-appropriate and relevant service projects throughout their time at the school.

Entrepreneurs Expo

A family favorite event at Aspen Academy is the Entrepreneurs Expo where each grade shows off the class business they created for the year. Problem solving and collaboration are key skills that are established leading up to and showcased at the expo.

AMP'd

Every other Friday, our students participate in a student-led, school-wide performance called AMP'd. Every AMP'd is packed with comedy, talent, and amazing performances showcasing two different grades each show.

Elevate is a comprehensive and centralized program that is imbued in the culture of the school here at Aspen Academy. Within Aspen Academy's entrepreneurial development and personal leadership programs, the Elevate team supports students, parents and teachers as we celebrate the unique qualities that each individual brings to the Aspen Academy family.

Recognizing that parents are the primary educators of their children, the Elevate program is consistently intentional about the authentic partnership that it creates with parents and guardians in the development of all children. Meeting students where they are, the Elevate program consistently utilizes coaching, intervention and professional
