#### **Music Curriculum Corner**

At Lindfield we try to develop our music and singing skills in all our subjects. Since the beginning of the year we have heard children learning to sing their times tables, using rhythm and music in history lessons, singing during PSHE sessions and learning French and Spanish vocabulary through song. Each year group also has taken inspiration from the BBC 'Ten Pieces' project, which is an exciting initiative for schools led by BBC Learning and BBC Performing groups. The aim is to open up the world of classical music to a new generation of children and inspire them to develop their own creative responses using a variety of art forms, digital art, animation, performance poetry, dance or movement and composition. We use the programme 'Charanga' to support music lessons. The children have access to djembe drums, xylophones and glockenspiels which allows them to find the rhythm within a song and play along. This also means that children can have a go at improvising and composing alongside the music they are studying in the lesson. We are also very excited to welcome back some instrumental teachers this year, it has been lovely to hear the sound of the guitar through the corridors!

# **Lindfield Sports Success Continues**

On Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> October, a group of boys from Years 5 & 6 participated in a football tournament involving six schools from the Haywards Heath area. They got off to an amazing start by beating Northlands Wood 1-0. In their second game they suffered an unfortunate 1-0 defeat against a great St Wilfrid's side. They bounced back brilliantly from that defeat to get another 1-0 win against Holy Trinity. In their 4<sup>th</sup> game against Harlands, they came back from 2-0 to win it with the last kick of the game, which ended 3-2. In their final game against Warden Park Primary they blitzed to a whopping 4-0 win. In the end, Mr Geddie's team finished 1<sup>st</sup> and will now compete in the next round in November.

# **OFSTED** inspection

# Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> and Wednesday 13<sup>th</sup> October 2021

As you are all aware, we welcomed five OFSTED inspectors into our Academy last week. The inspectors conducted a rigorous and challenging 2-day inspection based on the new OFSTED framework which came into practice in September 2019. This framework was different from the framework under which we were previously inspected in September 2018 for one day. This was an inspection that followed up on our previous one. The inspectors spoke to teachers, watched lessons, spoke to pupils and scrutinised the children's work. They also inspected safeguarding at our Academy. A report will be published shortly with their findings. Thank you all so much for completing the survey, speaking to the inspectors and wishing us luck. It meant a lot!
