- Marijuana Legalization Presentation: WHPD Reps. Nick Sanford and Joseph Hopkins discussed the new marijuana law and some effects of the law
  - i. Possession of up to 5oz of marijuana will be legal
  - ii. School offences:
    - 1st offence, referral to YSB/JRB
    - Over 5oz automatic summons
  - iii. Over 5oz is 500\$ for first offence, second offence is misdemeanor

- iv. 21+ can possess up to 5oz cannabis in a locked container in house or vehicle
- v. Paraphernalia is NO LONGER an offence for youth or adults
- vi. Places where smoking is prohibited: child care, school or school grounds,
- vii. For 16-17 year olds can be issued a 75\$ ticket if on school grounds
- viii. If someone smells like marijuana, it is no longer probable cause to search
- ix. There will be easier access to cannabis products

    - · Banners are up at the town center
    - · Flu vaccines are being administered
