The Importance of Routine

A good routine can play a huge factor in a middle school student's success. By establishing a routine early in the school year, you can potentially avoid frustration and stress for both you and your child. A dedicated morning routine for waking up, getting dressed and getting out the door will ensure that your student is to school on time and ready to learn. This can also help prevent bathroom bottlenecks, kitchen chaos and everyone leaving the house feeling rushed and agitated.

An after-school routine is equally important. For so many households, the evenings are notorious for being a tornado of activity. Rehearsals and practices must to be attended, dinner needs to be made, eaten and cleaned up and homework has to get done. An established routine is key to getting every-thing completed and helping the family maintain their sanity. Arrange a daily time that students need to devote to their schoolwork to ensure that it gets done and not forgotten about. This will also allow your child to fully focus on their extracurricular activities and not carry stress over into the next day.

Don't forget about a routine of checking Home Access Center (HAC) and Schoology with your child. Keeping up to date on grades and assignments will help prevent any surprises at the end of the marking period.

EMERGENCY PERMITS

If your child has an appointment (doctor, dentist, etc.) scheduled during school hours, or if an extended period of absence is anticipated (educational trips, vacation, etc.) the student must present a written request or an Emergency Permit form from a parent or guardian to the attendance office for approval at least one (1) day in advance of that absence.

Students are to present the Emergency Permit form to all teachers whose classes they will miss during the planned absence in order that their team of teachers may be notified of the impending absence and make advanced assignments. The Emergency Permit is to be returned to the Attendance office prior to the actual date of absence.

<u>Please note:</u> Emergency Permits are available in the Main office. They are also on our SMS website. On the website you would click on the **About** then click on **General information**. The permits are on the right side. You can download the permit, fill it out, and send it to: **SMSattendance@parklandsd.org**

OOPS, LEFT SOMETHING BEHIND AT HOME?

If your student has left something behind at home in the rush to get to school and someone will be dropping it off, please follow the procedure below. We will notify the student to come to the office for the forgotten item.

- Please have the item clearly marked with the student's name and grade
- Ring the outside buzzer at the main office entrance and state you are dropping off an item for your child.
- The 1st outside door will be unlocked so you may enter the vestibule area
- Place the item on or near the book shelf in the vestibule area

Student Assistance Program
