## **Board Items:**

**Pawnee Presentation** Tyler Clubb, director of facilities, introduced Justin Durham, partner/client leader for Hollis + Miller, who provided an update on the upcoming Pawnee Elementary School rebuild. Pawnee will be rebuilt as part of the \$264 million bond referendum approved by voters in January. Durham spoke about how Hollis + Miller gathered input from families, educators, staff, and Pawnee neighbors and incorporated their recommendations into plans for the building. ## **PLC Institute Presentation**

Dr. Darren Dennis, chief academic officer, and Dr. Britttany Gonser, director of professional learning, led a presentation on the Professional Learning Community (PLC) Institute to be held for educators in the Shawnee Mission School District. This Institute, put on by Solution Tree, will be an exclusive learning opportunity for Shawnee Mission teachers over three days in June, focused on building and sustaining strong Professional Learning Communities.

Jeremy Wayne, Westridge instructional coach, Kelly Bornheimer, Rhein Benninghoven instructional coach, and Linda Sieck, Shawnee Mission East Spanish teacher and President of NEA- Shawnee Mission, all offered testimonials of their experience at PLC conferences. Each spoke of the benefits this institute would provide teachers and how this training would ultimately support student achievement. The Board of Education unanimously approved the purchase order for the institute to be hosted in June of 2022.

Scholarship Shawnee Mission This month, more than 1,900 seniors received the news that they had received scholarshi offers through Scholarship Shawnee Mission. The <u>Shawnee Mission Education</u> Foundation traveled to all five high schools

and let students know how much colleges and universities want them to attend their schools by extending scholarship offers. The grand total this year is incredible. Our seniors received \$2.1 billion in scholarship offers from participating colleges and universities! This is the third year of the program, which begins with students and families sharing academic data with participating colleges and universities. Then, colleges and universities make scholarship offers to students whom they want to recruit. This year, 45 colleges and universities offered 45,765 scholarships to Shawnee Mission seniors. We give a big thanks to the Shawnee Mission Education Foundation for bringing these opportunities to our students through the Scholarship Shawnee Mission program.
