POSITION TITLE: Teacher – Visual Arts

Must be able to develop and provide interdisciplinary arts and humanities curriculum for deployment in classrooms for students and school staff.

PERFORMANCE EXPECTATIONS: Serves as a resource for school staff and students. Helps implement staff development programs to assure continuous professional growth. Provides instructional support by teaching in classrooms, planning with teachers and modeling best practices. Assists all staff in helping to assure continued improvements in instruction. Plans and develops units of art study that is relevant to the RPS curriculum as well as creates interdisciplinary units which align with core curriculum. Works and networks with local arts and educational organizations to bring about special programming within the school district. Assists with grant opportunities for staff and schools. Works with teachers in staff development sessions to augment their skills and knowledge in the area of arts and humanities. Develops interdisciplinary arts programming and special resource classes at the center for students. Curates, mats, hang and exhibits student work in numerous venues. Performs other related duties as assigned.

GENERAL DEFINITION AND CONDITIONS OF WORK: Duties performed typically in a school setting. Performs professional work providing teaching and/or training services to students and staff.
