- Monitors the instructional program for K-12 fine arts, including the development, implementation, and coordination of curriculum and programs
- Coordinates division-wide professional development, classroom embedded professional development, and topicspecific training sessions for fine arts teachers
- Observes fine arts instruction regularly and provides follow-up consultation and written, non-evaluative feedback to teachers and administrators

- Supports the management of the fine arts budgets, including state and national funds
- Ensures fine arts resources are ordered appropriately and distributed to schools in a timely manner

- Maintains a working relationship with relevant community stakeholders
- Coordinates the gathering and analysis of fine arts data
