Must possess an understanding of the skills and processes outlined in the Virginia Standards of Learning (SOL), college or university engineering competencies and the Virginia Department of Education Technology Education (Engineering) Competencies. Must have the ability to integrate Technology Education with engineering background and business industry curriculum. Experience preparing course outlines and developing curriculum to specifications with colleges and universities are essential. Must be willing to spend additional time after regular class hours to attend meetings, student competition events, recruitment projects, workshops, professional development activities. Must be able to demonstrate competency in Engineering subject areas and familiarity with current and projected new developments in curriculum and methodology for secondary and post secondary programs. Must have demonstrated excellent communications, strong technical, presentation, public relations and parent liaison skills. Must have the ability to develop and maintain high standards for self and students and present instruction in an interesting, creative and exciting manner. Must be willing to teach different secondary grade levels and work in a cooperative and collaborative manner with administrators, cluster leaders and work based learning coordinator, business/community stakeholders, other teachers, parents and students. Must be a team player and willing to plan and work with elementary, secondary, post-secondary educators and business industry on a daily basis.
