Must have a thorough knowledge of elementary education principles, practices and procedures. Candidate must have the ability to deliver oral presentations and written reports. Must have a comprehensive knowledge of the Virginia Standards of Learning and how curriculum may be organized to teach these standards to diverse learners. Must have extensive experience with successful teaching techniques, instructional materials, and current trends in the area of reading and integration of all content areas for elementary students. Must have demonstrated expertise with assessments, data analysis and the use of data to develop lesson plans and monitor instruction. Must have the ability to instruct and advise teachers in the skills necessary to differentiate instruction. Must have the ability to work in a cooperative manner with a variety of groups, including parents, teachers, staff and administrators.

PERFORMANCE EXPECTATIONS: Plans and implements staff development programs to for continuous professional growth of elementary teachers to provide effective instruction in the areas of reading and writing. Observes, monitors, and evaluates staff performance to assure continuous improvements in instruction. Assists in training of new teachers and paraprofessionals to ensure division and school achievement goals are met. Analyzes data related to student performance for the purpose of meeting the needs of low performing students.
