General Description:

The Instructional Specialist, English Language Arts Elementary provides leadership to Richmond Public Schools (RPS) efforts to advance literacy development for all students at the elementary level. The position supports teachers and administrators through professional development, coaching, and providing appropriately aligned resources to foster student academic success.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities:

- Monitors the instructional program provided by English/language arts classroom teachers and provide ongoing support to help teachers improve performance and achieve objectives;
- Supports teachers in ensuring the alignment of their lesson plans and instruction to the appropriate Virginia Standards of Learning and the Curriculum Framework;
- Stays abreast of the latest English/Language Arts program trends and methodology;
- Coordinates division-wide professional development, classroom embedded professional development, and topic-specific training sessions for content area teachers;
- Supervises the development, implementation, and coordination of curriculum and programs in the area of English/Language Arts from Preschool through 5th grade;
- Assists in establishing departmental curriculum objectives and implements a plan for the accomplishment of the objectives;
- Works with new teachers to ensure they have materials and competencies necessary for success;

- Observes classroom English/Language Arts instruction regularly and provides followup consultation and written non-evaluative feedback to teachers and administrators;
- Assists in the collection, review, and submission of all required information for state and federal reporting;
- Collaborates with RPS elementary English/Language Arts teachers and RPS curriculum staff to develop and implement a comprehensive writing program at the elementary level."
