North LaFayette Elementary school Wants to Help Parents and Family Members

North LaFayette Elementary school will take the following measures to promote and support parents and family members as they are an important foundation of the school. In order to strengthen the school and reach our school goals we will:

- √ Ensure that all information related to school and parent programs, meetings, and other activities is published in both English and Spanish, and posted on the school website and included in the monthly newsletter for all parents.
- √ Provide monthly trainings for staff during their planning periods on strategies to improve communication with parents and ideas to increase family engagement with reading and math activities for our students outside the classroom. Staff will also share best practices during regularly scheduled faculty meetings.
- √ Partner with early childhood programs, middle and high schools, college and career ready resources or organizations, parent resource centers, or other programs (as applicable) to help prepare their children for successful school transitioning.
- √ Share information on the school website and newsletter for parents to understand the school's academic standards and assessments as well as the ways parents can monitor their child's progress and work with educators.
- √ Communicate with all families and the community on a regular basis regarding school wide events and activities such as phone messages, flyers, and newsletters.
- √ Work with our parents and family members to develop relevant trainings and helpful presentations to educate our staff on the importance of parent and family engagement.

2021-2022 District Goals

What is Title 1?

North LaFayette Elementary is identified as a Title 1 school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title 1 is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging State academic standards in order to improve teaching and learning for students. Title 1 programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support family engagement. All Title 1 schools must jointly develop with parents and family members a written parent and family engagement plan.

School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it? This plan describes how North LaFayette Elementary will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. North LaFayette Elementary values contributions and involvement of parents and family members to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that North LaFayette Elementary will support family engagement and how parents can help and participate in activities and events to promote learning at school and at home.

How is it revised? North LaFayette Elementary welcomes parent input and comments at any time regarding the plan. All parent feedback will be used to revise the plan for next year. The plan is posted on our school website for parents to view and post feedback throughout the year. For families without internet access, paper copies of the survey will be made available on the information table outside the front office.

Who is it for? All students participating in the Title 1, Part A program and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. North LaFayette Elementary will provide opportunities for the full participation of parents with limited English, parents with disabilities, and of migratory children. Residential facilities at North LaFayette attendance area are included in the family engagement correspondence and activities.

Where is it available? At the beginning of the year, the plan is sent home with all students. The plan will also be available in the parent resource center, front office, and on the school website.
