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EXHIBIT B

Protection of Student Rights

All instructional materials, including teacher's manuals, films, tapes, or other supplementary material, that will be used in connection with any survey, analysis, or evaluation as part of any program funded in whole or in part by the U.S. Department of Education, shall be available for inspection by the parents or guardians of students.

No student will be required to participate in a survey, analysis, or evaluation as part of any program funded in whole or in part of the U. S. Department of Education without the prior written consent of the student's parent or, if the student is an emancipated minor or an adult, without the prior written consent of the student that reveals information concerning the following topics:

1. Political affiliations;
2. Mental and psychological problems potentially embarrassing to the student or his or her family;
3. Sex behavior and attitudes;
4. Illegal, anti-social, self-incriminating, and demeaning behavior;
5. Critical appraisals of other individuals with whom students have close family relationships;
6. Legally recognized privileged or analogous relationships, such as those of lawyers, physicians, and ministers; and/or
7. Income (other than that required to determine a child's eligibility for participation in a program or for receiving financial assistance under such a program).
