Our campus and school district have been working to revise attendance procedures so that communication is increased and assistance is given to any family with chronic unexcused absences. As part of our ongoing communication, this letter provides legally-required annual notification of consequences for failure to attend school.

If a student is absent from school on 10 or more days or parts of days within a six-month period in the same school year, the parent/guardian may be subject to criminal prosecution and the student may be referred to a truancy court for truant conduct.

Specifically, (Insert School Name) will enforce the Texas compulsory attendance laws as follows:

- Automated phone calls will be placed to parents or guardians notifying them when a student has been marked absent. It is the parent's or guardian's responsibility to ensure that he/she provides current and up to date contact information to the school.
- A student will be issued a warning notice when attendance records reflect that the student has absences without an excuse on three days or parts of days in a four-week period. Further, the parent/guardian will receive a request to attend a conference with the student for the purpose of addressing truancy prevention measures for students who exhibit attendance issues in order to improve the student's overall attendance. (*Texas Education Code* 25.087 & 25.0915)
- If a student fails to attend school without an excuse on 10 or more days or parts of days within a six-month period in the same school year and those absences have been verified by the campus as unexcused, students 12 and older may be referred to the prosecutor of the truancy court. At this point, the court could also file a criminal complaint against parents who contribute to the nonattendance of their child, regardless of their child's age. (*Texas Education Code 25.093*)

Attendance Procedures

- 1. Upon any student absence, an **automated phone call** will go to the parent/guardian the same day.
- Upon the student's return, he or she will have three school days to provide a note of excuse for any absence to the school's attendance clerk. [See Board Policy FEA(LEGAL) for a list of approved absences.]
- 3. Upon the **third unexcused absence in a four-week period**, a **Truancy Warning and Request for Conference Letter** will be emailed to the parent at the email address on record with the school, and Truancy Prevention Measures will be implemented by the campus principal or assistant principal.
- 4. If a student accrues ten unexcused absences in a six-month period, and the school determines the truancy prevention measures are not working, a truancy referral will be sent to the appropriate authority, unless the student is eligible for one of the four exceptions under the law.

TO THE PARENTS OF THE ABOVE-NAMED STUDENT:

The purpose of this warning notice is to inform you that your child's attendance records (see attached) indicate that he/she has been absent three (3) days or parts of days within a four-week period. According to Texas Education Code 25.095, the District is required to notify a student's parent if the student has been absent from school, without excuse, on three (3) days or parts of days within a four-week period, and that:

- 1. State law holds parents accountable for monitoring a student's school attendance and for requiring a student to attend school;
- 2. The student is subject to truancy prevention measures under TEC 25.0915; and
- 3. A parent is subject to prosecution and a fine under TEC 25.093 if a student fails to attend school without a legitimate excuse.

The statute further directs the school to request a conference between school officials and the parent to discuss the absences and truancy prevention measures. Please contact your child's assistant principal to schedule a conference.

When your student is absent, you need to contact the school each day by phone, emailing your campus attendance clerk, or submitting the digital form. The parent must provide written notification no later than 3 school days of returning to school. The note should include the student information (name, grade, school ID#), parent information (name and contact information), the date(s) of absence and reason for the absence. The Code of Conduct will be used to determine if the absence will be excused or unexcused.

Please review the attached attendance record and notify me of any discrepancies within five (5) school days of the date of this letter. Future absences will be monitored, and a referral to the court will be made if unexcused absences continue to occur. It is the school's hope that by making you aware of the laws regarding compulsory attendance, you will take the actions necessary to help your child avoid any unexcused absences in the future.

TO THE PARENTS OF THE ABOVE-NAMED STUDENT:

The purpose of this notification is to advise you that your child has an excessive number of absences for personal illness, as defined in Board policy FEC (LOCAL), in one or more of his/her classes as noted on the attached attendance record.

When a student's absence for personal illness exceeds five (5) consecutive days, or a total of six (6) absences, whole or part day in a school year, the student shall present a statement from a physician or health clinic verifying the illness or other condition requiring the student's absence from school. Campus attendance records indicate that your son/daughter has excessive absences for personal illness without documentation from a physician or health clinic. For the remainder of this school year, future absences or late arrivals by your child must be accompanied by a statement from a physician or health clinic verifying the child was seen or the school health coordinator can be contacted to determine whether the nature of the illness will be considered excused. Failure to do so will result in the student receiving an unexcused absence. In order to receive an excused absence for any unusual circumstances, you must request and receive prior approval from the campus principal.

Texas State law requires students to attend school for the entire day on each day that instruction is provided (compulsory attendance). If a student fails to attend school without an excuse on 10 or more days or parts of days within a six-month period in the same school year and those absences have been verified by the campus as unexcused, students 12 and older may be referred to the prosecutor of the truancy court. At that point, the court could also file a criminal complaint against parents who contribute to the nonattendance of their child, regardless of their child's age. (*Texas Education Code 25.093*)

Please review the attached attendance record and notify me of any discrepancies within five (5) school days of the date of this letter. It is the school's hope that by making you aware of the laws regarding compulsory attendance, you will take the actions necessary to help your child avoid any unexcused absences in the future.

The District cannot revoke the enrollment of a student age 19 or older on a day that the student is physically present in school. As an alternative to revocation, the District may impose a behavior improvement plan.

As required by law, this letter is to notify you of the consequences of failing to attend school. TRUANCY CASES FILED AGAINST PARENTS AND STUDENTS

In 2015, the 84th Texas Legislature changed Truancy from a **CRIMINAL** offense to a **CIVIL** offense for **students only**. Parents may be prosecuted under criminal law in connection with a student's failure to attend school. However, students will still receive consequences that include court costs, community service, attending campus tutorials, loss of driving privileges, mandatory counseling, and participation in certain family activities. A student is considered truant when 10 or more **UNEXCUSED** days or parts of days have occurred in a 6-month period of time.

A campus only has to make a "good faith effort" to contact parents. A case is not dismissed because a parent neglected to provide the school correct/updated information or refused to cooperate in the intervention process.

BOTH WHOLE AND PARTS OF A DAY ARE COUNTED.

Whether students have unexcused absences for **part** of the day **or** the **whole day**, 10 unexcused absences may lead to a court case. Being late to school (10 minutes or more) or class **may** lead to a partial day absence.

REQUIRED ATTENDANCE

Students who have not graduated are **required** by law (Education Code 25.085) to **attend school until the age of 19.**

Remember that a **phone call is not enough** to excuse an absence.

When your student is absent, you need to contact the school each day by phone, emailing your campus attendance clerk, or submitting the digital form. The parent must provide written notification no later than 3 school days of returning to school. The note should include the student information (name, grade, and school ID #), parent information (name and contact information), the date(s) of absence and reason for the absence. The Code of Conduct will be used to determine if the absence will be excused or unexcused.
