STUDENT SAFETY: BICYCLE/AUTOMOBILE USE

FFFD (REGULATION)

Students who drive motorized vehicles to and from school must:

- 1. Obtain and appropriately display a student parking permit;
- 2. Park in a designated student parking area on campus; and
- 3. Adhere to individual school parking rules.

CREDENTIALS

Students shall present a valid driver's license.

PARKING

Students shall request a parking permit before being eligible to park in approved student parking areas and to drive to and from school. A parking fee, determined by the Superintendent or Superintendent's designee, will be assessed.

DISCIPLINARY CONSEQUENCES FOR FIRST OFFENSE

Students, who fail to: 1) obtain a required parking permit, or 2) park in an approved student parking area, are subject to disciplinary action(s).

Unauthorized use of vehicles and/or parking lot violations are both listed as Level II offenses in the *Discipline Management Plan and Student Code of Conduct*. Students guilty of one of the state vehicle violations on school property or at a school-sponsored or school-related activity are also guilty of school rules and or procedures.

If a student who fails to comply with established rules for driving to and from school has already committed other disciplinary infractions, the first offense for parking violations, unauthorized use of a vehicle, and/or violation of school rules will result in a higher level disciplinary infraction and corresponding consequence.

SUBSEQUENT OFFENSE

The disciplinary consequence(s) for subsequent parking violations or unauthorized use of a vehicle will be contingent on the student's total disciplinary record.

LOSS OF DRIVING PRIVILEGES

A campus administrator may terminate a student's driving privileges at any time that he/she feels this action is appropriate. Loss of driving privileges does not allow another student driver to drive the offender's vehicle while he/she (the offender) rides as a passenger.

ILLEGALLY PARKED VEHICLES

Illegally parked cars may be towed at the owner's expense or impounded by a boot locked on a car tire.
