Founded in 1909, Lower Canada College is a selective, independent, K through Pre-University (grade 12) day school. For most of its history, LCC has been a boys' school, with coeducation in Pre-University since 1992. Since September 1995, LCC has been coeducational at all levels. In 2021–2022 girls constitute 44% of the school population.

The school has an enrolment of approximately 853 students in the Junior School (K through grade 6), Middle School (grades 7 and 8), Senior School (grades 9 through 11), and Pre-University (grade 12). The student/teacher ratio is 11:1.

The school seeks able students who are interested in challenging themselves academically and contributing to other aspects of school life. The student body is diverse, representing over 28 nationalities (including Canada), with students speaking 32 different languages other than English as their mother tongue. One hundred per cent (100%) of our graduates continue their education at college or university. Twenty per cent (20%) of our students from grades 7-12 receive financial aid.

LCC is an International Baccalaureate World School. Students participating in the IBDP also fulfill the requirement of the Diplôme d'études secondaires (DES). Students not taking the IB Diploma Programme are eligible to do IB courses over one and two years with permission from the instructor (some exceptions apply). There are currently 34 students enrolled in Year 1 and 33 students enrolled in Year 2 of the IB Diploma Programme. There are 11 students taking individual IB courses. In June 2020, LCC also became an IB MYP authorized school, making it the only English high school in Quebec offering both the Middle Years and Diploma Programmes.

LCC has been a member of Round Square since 2007. Round Square is a worldwide association of almost 200 schools across six continents sharing unique and ambitious goals. Students attending Round Square schools make a strong commitment, beyond academic excellence, to personal development and responsibility.

ACCREDITATION

The Quebec Ministry of Education (Ministère de l'Éducation et de l'Enseignement supérieur or MEES), International Baccalaureate, and the Canadian Accredited Independent Schools (CAIS) accredit the school. LCC is a member of CAIS, the Quebec Association of Independent Schools (QAIS), FEEP (Fédération des établissements d'enseignement privés), the National Association of Independent Schools (NAIS) in the United States, and IB.

GRADE STRUCTURE

Secondary V (grade 11) is the final year of secondary school in Quebec, after which students may enter a two-year program at a CEGEP (Collège d'enseignement général et professionnel) and then subsequently enter a three-year undergraduate university program in Quebec or Canada. The Pre-University year at Lower Canada College corresponds to the final year of secondary school (grade 12) elsewhere in North America and is of interest to those who wish to pursue a four-year undergraduate program in Canada, the United States or abroad.

As the longest standing Pre-University Grade 12 program in Montreal, LCC enrols both LCC graduates and graduates of other secondary schools in the Montreal area and from further afield. LCC graduates have the opportunity to complete the Year 2 IB Diploma Programme option and/or a Grade 12 Diploma. Graduates joining LCC's Pre-University from other high schools only have the option to complete the Grade 12 Diploma.

Both LCC graduates and other secondary school graduates must apply to the Pre-University program. Admissions is based on a holistic assessment of marks, co-curriuclar involvement, an admissions essay and an interview.

CURRICULUM

For Middle and Senior School students, the school year is divided into two terms. All classes extend over the full course of the academic year. A normal course load consists of 10 courses in grades 9, 10 and 11. Each class meets three to four times per week, with greater frequency in English, French and mathematics (core subjects). In 2021-2022, the enrolment in grade 11 is 100 students.

Pre-University students have two terms and take six full-year courses. All courses are university preparatory and rigorous in nature. Students in the Pre-University program take courses that are based on the Ontario Grade 12 university-level curriculum. Students also have the option of selecting AP Calculus and AP Psychology. Student progress is reported twice during the year and all marks are cumulative. Students are assessed in accordance with the Ontario Ministry of Education expectations. In 2021-2022, the enrolment in Pre-U is 75 students.

The IB curriculum comprises a 'core' and six subject groups. Even though these courses run over the two-year period, the IB curriculum gels with the Quebec curriculum and all students fulfill their high school leaving requirements after grade 11.

STANDARDIZED TESTING

Standardized testing is optional for students interested in pursuing post-secondary education outside of Canada. We do not provide any preparation for SAT or ACT examinations as part of the academic curriculum. Historically, less than 30% of the Pre-University class takes the SAT or ACT. In the 2020-2021 school year, LCC closed as a testing centre due to COVID-19 restrictions, as did many other centres in Canada. LCC reopened as a testing centre for the 2021-2022 school year, however registration is limited and few opportunities are available elsewhere in Quebec for testing. Due to limited access in 2020-2021, as well as restricted travel opportunities for students to take testing elsewhere, we currently do not have accurate and up-to-date results to share. Testing opportunities are limited at this time in this region.





COVID-19 RESPONSE FOR SCHOOL PROFILE & THE COMMON APPLICATION

MARCH 2020 - JUNE 2020

As per the directive of the provincial government and public health office, schools in Quebec closed on March 13, 2020. Senior School and Pre-U students (grades 9-12) returned to class via "virtual school" as scheduled on March 17, 2020, and all students were actively engaged in synchronous and asynchronous full-time classes for the duration of the school year. At the end of the term, in June 2020, students completed end-of-year learning activities in lieu of final exams.

Final percentage marks were provided for students on the LCC transcript, however, following the directive of the Quebec Ministry of Education, final marks were required to not be lower than what was reported in Term II (February 2020). With the cancellation of final ministry of education exams, the MEES (provincial) transcript does not provide percentage grades for the 2019-2020 academic year. Only an "REU" (meaning "réussir" or achieved) indicated a pass in order for students to meet their Diplôme d'études secondaires (DES), which is the (high school diploma) requirements.

SEPTEMBER 2020 – JUNE 2021

In the 2020-2021 school year, the Quebec Government changed the the Senior School reporting structure, dividing it into two terms instead of three. Term one counted for 35% and term two for 65% of a student's final mark. Ministry exams were cancelled again, however final marks from local high schools were submitted to the ministry and are depicted on a student's final LCC and MEES report.

The government required that all students be grouped into stable/fixed cohorts. Cohorts were not permitted to physically mingle, limiting opportunities for normal co-curricular opportunities during the school year. LCC was also mandated by the government to operate on a hybrid model, with grade 9-11 students alternating every other day between virtual and in-person learning.

SEPTEMBER 2021 – JUNE 2022

The Quebec government decided to keep the two-term structure for the high school (grades 7-11). Term one will be worth 35% and term two will be 65% of a student's final mark. Students are attending classes in person on a full-time basis.
