

At the February 22, 2021, School Board Meeting, the **Board unanimously approved** the **Secondary Boundary and Bell Time Task Force's recommendation for secondary boundaries**. Option D4a best meets the primary criteria of equitable distribution of socioeconomic status and racial composition, as well as all the other evaluation criteria. Some other key highlights of the approved option include:

- Only one middle school (Patrick Marsh) sends students to both high schools and does so equitably on east/west lines.
- This is the best of all options in minimizing the number of K–5 students separated from some peers at both transitions (~10%).
- This option respects neighborhood boundaries and creates opportunities for continuing to grow as a united community.
- This option sets up the District to grow equitably into the future.
- Consensus of the Task Force: 70% chose D4a as their final option, and 91% voted to recommend to the School Board.

Sun Prairie High School has experiential learning academies called ACCEL Academy. ACCEL started in the fall of 2020 with a Global Business Academy and a Global Food and Sustainability Academy.

Why ACCEL? Students enrolled in an ACCEL Academy work on their transferable skills and gain experience to better prepare themselves for internships, part-time jobs, and full-time jobs. By exploring and experiencing potential professions, students realize their strengths and passions. This allows them to make informed decisions about their future. As the job market continues to become more competitive, our students are working on the skills and experiences needed to separate themselves from the rest of the pack, all while receiving three credits toward graduation!

ACCEL instructors develop real-world, project-based learning strategies through collaboration with business and community partners. Multiple project partners have implemented student projects at their companies, including M3 Insurance, Trek, Cranberry Creek Cranberries, Marda Angus Farms, Statz Bros. Farms, Beans n Cream, Sassy Cow Creamery, and Findorff.

We have been working in partnership with the Pacific Educational Group (PEG) as part of our strategic goal to eliminate the opportunity gap for students of color through racial equity. The staff at PEG have been working with District staff and community members to transform beliefs, behaviors, and results so students of all races can achieve at their highest level. Three teams have been formed to learn the Courageous Conversation protocol to help us engage in deep interracial dialogue and to address persistent racial disparities. The three teams within our system are as follows:

- District Equity Leadership Team (DELT): Composed of the superintendent, assistant superintendents, and District Support Center administrators.
- LEADS: Made up of all site and District administrators as well as program managers and administrative support staff.
- Site Race and Equity Teams: Made up of seven to ten members from each school site.

All three teams began their equity journey by participating in the Beyond Diversity seminar and have participated in quarterly staff development. All teams have been charged with examining the impact of race on student learning and creating strategic actions to address disparities that exist at each site. The results of this work have been shared in our District, department, and site action plans.

The Sun Prairie Area School District offers FREE four-year-old kindergarten. Online registration for the 2022–2023 school year starts February 1! Any child who is age four by September 1, 2022, is eligible to register for the 2022–2023 school year.

The SP4K program is a voluntary early learning program available to all four-year-old children in Sun Prairie, comprised of ten community partner sites, two school-based sites, over 500 students, and 40 teachers, co-teachers, and teaching assistants. These early years are so important in the growth and development of young learners, and our program is designed to meet the unique and diverse learning needs of these students. Our SP4K curriculum is a developmentally appropriate, play-based approach to learning. We believe in educating the whole child, focusing on the growth of a child's social, emotional, cognitive, and physical needs in order to build a solid and broad foundation for lifelong learning and well-being. In our program, students practice routines and learning behaviors that will support their transition to kindergarten.






