**SUBJECT: Dress and Grooming**

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The expression of a student's uniqueness and individuality by means of the student's dress is recognized. Restrictions on freedom of student dress will be imposed whenever the mode of dress in question is a:

1. Contrary to law.
2. Unsafe, either for the student or those around the student.
3. Disruptive of school operations and the education process.

No restrictions on freedom of dress and adornment will be imposed which:

1. Reflect discrimination as to civil rights.
2. Reflect discrimination as to particular codes of morality or religious tenets.
3. Attempt to dictate or adjudicate style or taste.
