OhioMeansJobsReadiness Seal	Meet the requirements and criteria set by the readiness seal, including demonstration of work-readiness and professional competencies.								
Ohio Seal of Biliteracy	Meet the requirements and criteria, including proficiency on assessments in a world language and English. We offer the Avant STAMP 4s or Avant STAMP WS testing twice each year (fall and spring) and AP tests (late spring).								
Industry-Recognized Credential Seal	Earn a 12-point approved industry-recognized credential or group of credentials totaling 12 points in a single career field.								
College-Ready Seal	Earn remediation-free scores on the ACT or SAT. 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Military Enlistment Seal	Provide evidence that a student has enlisted in a branch of the U.S. Armed Forces or participate in an approved JROTC program for at least two years.								
Citizenship Seal <i>(Students must meet one of the criteria for both US History and US Government to earn this seal.)</i>	A student can: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Earn a score of proficient or higher on US History and US Government OST; or 2. Earn a score that is at least equivalent to proficient (2 or better) on the appropriate AP (US History and US Government and Politics) or IB exams; or 3. Earn a “B” or higher in appropriate classes taken through College Credit Plus for both US History and US Government. or 4. Earn a “B” or higher in US History and US Government course 								

<p>Science Seal</p>	<p>A student can:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Earn a score of proficient or higher on Biology OST; <p>or</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 2. Earn a score that is at least equivalent to proficient (2 or better) on an appropriate AP (Biology, Chemistry, Physics 1, Physics 2, Physics C: E&M, Physics C: Mechanics) or IB exam; <p>or</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 3. Earn a “B” or higher in any three-credit hour science course taken through College Credit Plus. <p>or</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 4. Earn a “B” or higher in an advanced science course (grades in biology and honors biology do not meet this criteria)
<p>Technology Seal</p>	<p>Earn a score that is at least equivalent to proficient (2 or better) on an appropriate AP exam (Computer Science A or Computer Science Principles)</p>
<p>Honors Diploma Seal</p>	<p>Earn one of six Honors Diplomas:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Academic Honors Diploma 2. International Baccalaureate Honors Diploma 3. Career-Tech Honors Diploma 4. STEM Honors Diploma 5. Arts Honors Diploma 6. Social Science and Civic Engagement Honors Diploma

Locally Defined Seals

Fine and Performing Arts Seal	<i>Demonstrate skills in the fine or performing arts according to an evaluation aligned with guidelines adopted by the student's local board of education or school governing authority.</i>
<p>During his/her high school career (9th grade and after), a student can:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● Earn at least two credits in fine arts courses <p>OR</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● Participate in two or more fine/performing arts programs/performances inside/outside of school (verification form completed by the student and signed by the teacher/director from the outside organization)	
Student Engagement Seal	<i>Participate in extracurricular activities such as athletics, clubs or student government to a meaningful extent, as determined by guidelines adopted by the student's local board of education or school governing authority.</i>
<p>During his/her high school career (9th grade and after), a student can:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● Participate in at least one year of two or two years of one of the following activities (<i>Note: Students earning the PE waiver will automatically earn this seal.</i>):<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ Athletics*○ Marching Band○ Show Choir○ Theater*○ School-sponsored/board approved club● Students will need club advisor/director to verify satisfactory participation <p>*If a student is using non-school sponsored athletics or theater, they will need to complete a verification form signed by the coach/director.</p>	

Community Service Seal

Complete a community service project aligned with the guidelines by the student's local board of education or school governing authority.

During his/her high school career (9th grade and after), a student can:

- Complete 120 community service hours over 4 years

OR

- Complete 40 community service hours during senior year
 - Pro-rated to 20 hours for seniors who move in January of their senior year
- At least 50% of a student's hours need to be in one concentrated field
- Student will complete a form that logs hours, describes service and has verification signature(s)
