Our retreat programs have empowered thousands of Rockets for lives of active discipleship. Students are actively engaged in and challenged by our comprehensive academic programs, regardless of their performance and ability levels. As students of all learning styles work side-by-side, they gain perspective and appreciation for different strengths and abilities in others while, at the same time, developing their own. Flexible, customized learning pathways encourage students' interests and challenge them to keep pace in a world of perpetual change.

Highly-motivated students can earn college credits through 19 Advanced Placement courses. Honors classes, AP courses, and other accelerated courses are weighted in the GPA calculation. College Prep courses are offered in every subject, including three levels of math and English.

Our College Credit Plus program allows students to earn college and high school credits at the same time. McNicholas partners with three area universities, including the University of Cincinnati's Early IT Program.

Our SAIL Program addresses the needs of identified students of all academic levels. Students in the SAIL Program are mainstreamed into college preparatory, honors, and Advanced Placement classes, and receive accommodations and services including one-on-one tutoring, coursework support, reading assistance, extended testing time, test readers, scribes, and weekly progress reports.

visual arts

Our exceptional faculty artists offer the guidance and technical skills needed to help students discover their creative capacity.

Our Visual Arts Program is flexible, meeting the needs of students who simply want to fulfill a required art credit, as well as those who are looking for a four-year studio program that allows them to pursue an interest or a career in the arts. We emphasize the connections among creativity, communication, collaboration, critical thinking, and creative problem-solving.



Our program features 23 Visual Arts courses; the only Catholic Architecture Program in Cincinnati; iPad and Apple Macbook Pro Labs for digital photography, architecture, and industrial design projects; state-of-the-art ceramics program and kiln room which houses Raku Kiln, Glass Kiln, Bailey Gas, Electric, and Test Kiln; traditional darkroom and full digital photo lab; opportunities for on-campus College Credit Plus courses with travel study abroad option.



Headed by a Broadway veteran, our award-winning Theatre
Department boasts 4 levels of theatre classes for academic credit, a full complement of theatrical training during the regular school day.



Students are trained in all disciplines of the theatrical arts, including acting, theatre history, basic technical theatre, stage management, directing, producing, theatre criticism, playwriting, and audition and interviewing techniques. In addition to classroom experiences and showcases, students can participate each year in our three mainstage performances, as well as our active Improv Troupe and all-school Talent Show. Professional workshops from various industry professionals, including Scott Levy, from Second City in Chicago, and class trips to professional theatres, including Cincinnati Shakespeare, Playhouse in The Park, and The Aronoff, complement students' classroom training. Additionally, senior students have the opportunity to participate in the locally-sponsored or Thespian-sponsored college auditions known as the Unifieds.

McNicholas High School Athletics' rich history in the Greater Catholic League has helped us to produce over 20 appearances in state championships and hoist 9 championship trophies.

As part of the GCL Co-Ed, which continues to be recognized as one of the strongest leagues in the state of Ohio, McNicholas Athletics fosters the development of strong Christian values. Our sports are highly respected, and bring excitement, camaraderie, and spirit to our campus.

As members in good-standing of the Ohio High School Athletic Association (OHSAA), we compete in Division II or III for state tournaments. We sponsor approximately 26 teams in 16 boys' and girls' sports.
