What is School-Parent Compact?

A School-Parent Compact is an agreement that parents, students, and staff members develop together. It explains how parents, students and teachers can work together to ensure all of our students achieve success.

School Responsibilities:

Northside Elementary will:

1. Provide high-quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment that supports children in meeting the State's student academic achievement standards.
2. Provide parents with frequent reports on their children's academic and behavioral progress. In each classroom we will provide progress reports through Parent/Teacher conferences, samples of student work, updates on reading, writing and math assessments. We will initiate a parent contact at the first signs of a pattern of behavior that interferes with student learning.
3. Set high expectations for staff, students and parents by ensuring challenging curriculum, implementing programs targeted at increasing student achievement and committing to recruit, retain, and train qualified staff. Also, highlight/prepare ways that the parent can advance the learning environment at home.
4. Provide parents reasonable access to staff. Teachers may be contacted through phone, Dojo, email or written requests to meet on their conference time or at an alternate time mutually convenient to the parent and teacher.
5. Provide parents opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child's class, and to observe classroom activities, as defined by grade level teams or Parent Involved in Education (PIE) commitments.
6. Due to COVID-19, the campus may be closed to visitors at times in accordance with district guidelines. Meetings may be virtual and/or face to face, depending on the campus closure status.

Parent Responsibilities

Northside Elementary Parents will:

1. Establish routines to support my child's success in school:
 - o appropriate bedtime
 - o monitor attendance
 - o homework & reading
 - o nutrition
 - o grooming & hygiene
2. Communicate the significance of success in school and its relationship with success in life.
3. Ensure that my child attends school on a regular basis and arrives to school on time. For remote students, make sure to log in to my child's remote learning platform by 10:00 am.
4. Make sure that my child's assignments are completed and submitted on time.
5. Stay informed about my child's education and communicate with the school by promptly reading all notices from the school or the school district either received by my child, by mail, or by electronic communication and responding as appropriate in a timely manner.
6. Provide internet access for temporary remote learners, and return the district-issued chromebook to the campus at the end of the year or upon return to campus.
7. Parents may be able to volunteer on campus. However, this is subject to change. Due to COVID-19, the campus may be closed to visitors at times in accordance with district guidelines.

Student Responsibilities

Northside Elementary Students will:

1. Attend school regularly and arrive to school on time. Remote students should log in to their online learning platform by 10:00 am.
2. Complete all daily assignments and submit them on time.
3. Be responsible for giving my family members all information sent home from school.
4. Bring all necessary supplies to school for face to face learning, including a mask. Temporary remote students should have all necessary supplies for online learning, including internet access and a district-provided chromebook, which must be returned to campus at the end of the year.
5. Students will adhere to adult directives and follow all classroom and campus expectations.

Note: *Due to COVID-19, the campus may be closed to visitors at times in accordance with district guidelines. At no time are visitors allowed on campus during Benchmark Testing weeks, as well as State Testing weeks. Visitors MUST have a VALID ID in order to receive a visitor's pass.*
