## **The Northshore Concert Hall Continues to Move Toward Completion**

Bothell, Wash. – The Northshore Concert Hall project located at Inglemoor High School continues to move toward completion.

Throughout October the team has been working on the finishes for acoustics, cabinets, lockers for instruments, wall panels, tiles and more. Every material that is being used in the Concert Hall is designed to reflect or absorb sound to ensure the best possible acoustics. From the rounded surfaces for sound reflection to the wood floor that will be installed in the front of the space, which will act like another drum to enhance the sound. Key sound details are also being installed in the three music classrooms, including acoustic panels and carpeted panels on the walls to enhance the sound. Mechanical systems for the building are complete and are now being tested to ensure they work as expected.

The team awaits the delivery of the seats for the Concert Hall, which are shipping on time. Due to the constraints at the ports, it is expected that unloading the seats will delay the project about a month. It is now anticipated that the Concert Hall will be completed at the end of January 2022.

Outside the building, the team finished pouring concrete for the decorative steps near the Concert Hall entrance. The focus is moving to landscaping and grass will be placed in November.

This project was made possible by the generous support of Northshore voters, who approved the 2018 bond.
