Your contest submission, along with a [student entry form](#), must be completed and submitted by **Monday, November 29th**. After the PTA has received all submissions, local artists will review the submissions and decide which submissions should advance to the state level. At the state level student's submissions will compete against other highschoolers in the state. The winners at the state level will go on to compete nationally in Washington D.C. Competing at this level is a very prestigious honor.

Parents are asked to encourage and support their students with time management, materials, etc., but are asked to not assist in any way with the students interpretation of the theme or artistic expression.
