Please Get Out to Vote On the Turf and Track Referendum

As you may know the turf field and track surfaces are much past their normal life expectancy, nearly 8 years past that time.... On November 2, there will be a ballot question and an opportunity to change that

Shall the Order entitled **"ORDER AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF UP TO \$1,900,800 IN BONDS OF THE TOWN TO FUND THE COST OF THE HIGH SCHOOL TURF FIELD AND TRACK REPLACEMENT**" be approved?

We hope you join us in our efforts to spread the word to Vote on November 2. Our turf/track facility is in such poor condition that we do not know season to season whether it will be playable or not.

Project History

The track was first installed in 1979. In 2006, the track underwent a second resurfacing and the original turf was installed. Since then, there has been ongoing maintenance to support the active use of both amenities. A typical lifespan for a turf surface is eight- ten years (reached in 2016). It has surpassed its lifespan and is beyond the point of being remedied by general maintenance alone. There are safety concerns brought on by the deterioration of surface material and tripping hazards on the field.

Sports and activities are vital to the education of students to help support well-rounded and civic minded adults. Students learn lifelong lessons that complement the academic lessons taught in the

classroom, and these programs cost just over 2% of the overall school's budget. We are proud of our school system as people move to Scarborough in part, because of its schools and our athletics/activities programs. **Good schools make good communities.**

Impact if Approved

This renovation project does not only benefit student athletes; it benefits the community and user groups of all ages. There are nearly 18 different groups who use the turf and track, ranging from students, athletes, community services program participants, residents, youth sports leagues and clubs. From the Fall of 2018 to Summer of 2019, this amounted to 1,100 hours of scheduled use for various activities and programs.

Impact if Not Approved

If not approved, the damage will worsen and cost to fix will rise. This was proven true when it was not approved in the 2019 referendum at \$1.2 million. The current project cost is an estimated \$1.9 million. It also faces the potential for closure when safety risks become too high. Closure of the facility would impact programming offered through the School Department as well as increase the demand on other town fields. Closure would also affect much of the youth programming offered through Community Services and private clubs. Additionally, there would be potential costs for the schools to rent facilities outside of Scarborough to continue offering existing athletic programs.

The decisions we make on November 2nd related to the turf/track project affect our children's daily lives. Elections are our chance to stand up for what matters most to us and to have an impact on the issues that affect us, our communities, our families and our future. Please be educated when you go to the polls on November 2nd to vote....



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2021-2022 Breakfast & Lunch Ordering Protocols

As a general reminder, all breakfast and lunch meals for all students in Scarborough Schools are free for this school year 2021-2022. All existing students whose parents have an account will be able to order breakfast and lunch using the same procedure as last year, from the Nutrislice app on a device or at <u>https://www.scarboroughschools.org/</u> (at the top of the page click "Quick links", then go to School Lunch for all meal menus).

All Kindergarten and new students to the district will have to make a Nutrislice account through the Nutrislice app or through <u>https://scarboroughschools.nutrislice.com/menu/create-account</u> before they can order breakfast and lunch. Parents will need the child's ID# before they can start the registration process.

For breakfast meals in all of our schools, you can order online on the same day before 6:30 AM, while for lunch meals, you can order online on the same day before 7:30 AM. You can order meals for the day, or set up a weekly or monthly plan for meals to be provided to your children. The menus for all meals for a new month will be posted on the school's website and on the Nutrislice app the last Monday at the end of the previous month.

Each school has created their own system for their lunch disbursement. They are continually reviewing

towards improving and refining their daily lunch routines.
