If you are considering an independent or parochial school:

- **Schedule** tours and interviews and attend webinars at high schools of interest.
- **Determine** if your child will be taking the SSAT and then **Request** Accommodations and **Register** for the test – See the Secondary School Advising/SSAT section, located in the Parent Community, Pages for information on how to work through this process.

- **Determine** if you are applying to a parochial school and register for the High School Placement Test (HSPT). Many area parochial schools administer the test, approve accommodation requests, and offer test prep courses.
- **Familiarize** yourself with Ravenna (ravenna-hub.com) and the Standard Application Online/SAO (enrollment.org) as these are the most common and preferred application methods for independent schools.

If you are considering public school:

- **Register** with your local school district (if you don't have a current IEP)
- **Contact** your town's middle and high school special education departments and let them know of your intention to enroll in the high school
- **Join** your town's SEPAC (Special Education Parent Advisory Council) to gain more information on services provided in your school district
