Dieringer School District schools were closed on the order of Governor Inslee on March 12, 2020. There was no expectation that student learning occur the week of March 16, 2020. Monday, March 16th was a non-workday for classified staff. DCPEA staff worked the remainder of the week, March 17th through March 20th. The non-workday on March 16th moved the end of the school year to June 17, 2020.

As a result of guidance issued from OSPI per WAC 392-901 the school year was extended for students a maximum of five days or until June 19, 2020. In order to have the last student day of the 2019-2020 school year be June 19th for Dieringer students, DCPEA members will take time off equal to two regular workdays between May 18, 2020 and June 12, 2020.

Staff should work with their principal and supervising teachers to schedule the days or times they will be unavailable to students and unavailable for building or district meetings. Staff and administration should work together to ensure an appropriate number of staff are still available each day to provide support for students and parents. DCPEA members are not eligible to take days off where they are scheduled for onsite work in childcare, meal service, or meal delivery. As a courtesy, staff should notify their principal at least 48 hours in advance.
