Back-to-School Update (cont)

While excited about being back in school, we are also seeking to address 3 important concerns that have been raised:

- 1. Student behavior, particularly in the Lower School
- 2. Teacher stress and burnout concerns
- 3. Learning gaps as a result of remote/hybrid learning

All of these concerns are <u>related</u> and all our <u>fundamental</u> to everything we do as a school - they are related to our long term <u>AMSA 2025 Project</u>

To address these concerns we are:

Openly <u>acknowledging the problem</u> and the bumpy start we are having

 Working with our administrators, department chairs, teachers, and counselors to develop <u>immediate</u> and <u>long-term solutions</u>

 Pivoting from our original plans for our November 17th PD - we will now focus on student behavior and teacher stress (Department chairs will be working with their teams on learning gaps)


Professional Development - November 17th

2021 MCAS - What was different for 10th graders?


- MCAS canceled in 2020 and then students remote for a year
- In-person students took the MCAS, those remote had a choice to take exam or defer to fall - 27 deferred
- In-person students tested in classrooms, remote students tested in the cafeteria
- MCAS is NOT being used for accountability only for academic planning purposes




Building Update
